Following is to clarify reporting procedures.

OSWAID conclusively established as assessin of President KENNEDY. Investigation continuing to develop complete data regarding bim, his activities and determine if assassination was inspired or directed by any other person or group and determine if such persons or groups assisted him any way. Investigation must be expedited. Communications in his case should, therefore, be restricted to information pertaining to him and to allegations that a person or group had a specific connection with him in the assassination. Results of investigation should be submitted by teletype summary under IS - R caption. followed by reports. No airtels, letterhead memoranda or letters should be submitted.

The Civil Rights aspects of this matter concern following questions and should be reported under Civil ; Rights caption.

Mrs.Oswald Claims Son Was 'Fall Guy'

By BOB SALLEE Democrat Staff Writer

Mrs. Marguerite Oswald gives the impression that she is a woman possessed by the belief that her son, Lee Harvey Oswald, was a fall guy in some kind of State Department plot to kill President Kennedy.

- Throughout an hour long program on KATV Channel 7 last night, Mrs. Oswald fielded questions from the public, insisting steadfastly that Oswald avas not the killer of President Kennedy. Channel 7 paid Mrs. Oswald's expenses—her airplane ticket and a night's, lodging at a hotel—for her appearance here, according to both Mrs. Oswald and Channel 7.

The greying, plump woman of 56, remained cool and collected throughout the broadcast as well as when facing reporters later at a press conference.

Mrs. Oswald harped on her theory that Oswald was a government agent caught up in a trap because of "a slip somewhere" in the State Department.

She could offer nothing concrete to back up her contentions; however.

She flayed the press at times, accusing newspapers in general of "exploiting" Oswald and making him look bad. He's not like the newspapers say, she declared. "I happen to know

Mrs. Oswald said sne hat been "retracting statements" for four months.

In spite of her denials that Oswald was the killer, she wavered several times. To the question, "Do you think your son was paid to kill President Kennedy?" Mrs. Oswald replied: "This I do not know..."

Later, a reporter asked her if she excluded the possibility that her son was guilty. She said, "Oh, no." .Mrs. Oswald bases much of her "case" on what she

has read in the newspapers that tends to contradict some reports, but is quick to frdict the newspapers in gencral when reports are not favorable to her point of

view. Mrs. Oswald said she thinks Jack Ruby was a paid hiller and said she wanted him alive for selfish reasons. "Now if we shut his mouth, there will be nobody left," she explained. "Not Louse"

The Oswalds are an average American family, she said, and her son was not "the louse he was made out to be."

Mrs. Oswald based her belief that Lee was an agent on several factors other than his mysterious behavior. She said he knew how to read, write and spcak Russian before he "defected" to Russia in 1961; was able to obtain a visa in a single day when he was a known defector; had some source of income but wasn't working regularly.

Mrs. Os wald said she didn't sce her son from October 1962 until after the assassination because she felt he was a sccret agent and didn't want her involved in anything. He had moved abruptly from Fort Worth to Dallas.

Mrs. Oswaid denied that she was trying to commercialize on the death of her son and the President and declared: "I'm the only one who is not making money . some are getting rich. "It's quite an ordeal for a woman of 56 to go around, speaking emotionally, lets (Indicate page, name of newspaper, city and state.)

Dallas Officer Confirms He Reported FBI Agent's Suspicions of Oswald

DALLAS-Lt. Jack Revill of the Dallas Police confirmed Friday that he reported to his superiors on November 22 that an FBI agent had said of Lee Harvey Oswald: "We knew he was capable of assassinating the president."

Revill said he heard the comment from FBI Special Agent James (Joe) Hosty in the Dallas Police Department shortly after President John F. Kennedy had been assassinated and Oswald had been taken into custody. Hosty fictly denied making the statement.

Another police officer was present when the remark was made, Revill said at Sacrameno, Cal., where he was attending a convention.

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said in Washington: "This is absolutely false. The agent made no such statement and the FBI did not have such knowledge."

Tells of Memo

The Dallas Morning News, in a copyright article by Hugh Aynesworth, said Friday that a source close to the Warren Com-mission told of a memo given The Dallas Morning News, in mission told of a memo given the Commission by Dallas Po-lice Chief Jesse Curry containing the alleged remark by Hosty.

According to this memo, the News said, Hosty, only mo-ments after Oswald was arrested, said:

"We knew he was capable of assassinating the president but we didn't dream he'd do it."

Hosty said he could only deny that he ever made such a statement, and would not comment further.

Some reports after the assassination said the FBI had investigated Oswald before the president's slaying and an agent was said to have visited the Oswald home. 🕤

Revill, who heads the Crimi-nal Intelligence Solion of the police Special Service Bureau, appeared before the Warren Commission in Dallas several several reeks ago. Chief Curry test fied before the Commission Washington Wednesday.

'He Was Excited'

Revill said Friday that he had submitted a memorandum jo gurry after he heard the statement. Of Agent Hosty, Revill said:

"He was excited, everyone was excited, and he probably said some things he shouldn't have.

"My statement will stand • • • if it boils down to a swearing match, I had one of my men

Revill declined to go into the details of the memorandum. He said any further comment would fave to be made by Curry. Curry could not be reached for comment and other police officials declined to discuss the matter.

The Dallas Times Herald said Briday that Hosty's name an peared in a notebook found in Oswald's possession. The paper said Hosty had called at the home of Mrs. Ruth Paine in suburban Irving, where Oswald's wife was living, seeking infopmation about Oswald. Apparently, Mrs. Paine i formed Oswald of the visit an Hosty's name, the paper said.

WASHINGTON (AP) - Sen. Richard Schweiker, R-Pa., is seeking to have the Senate Intelligence Committee take a new look at the assassination of President John F. Kennedv.

An aide to Schweiker confirmed the plan Sunday, and U.S. News & World Report quoted Schweiker as saying: "Up until a few months ago I was one who believed the Warren Commission's conclusion that (Lee Harvey) Oswald had acted alone. But all these new developments have caused me to question some of the Commission assumptions...To n.e it's like a big, public boil that s going to burst."

Schweiker is sponsoring a resolution calling on the Senate Intelligence Committee. which has been investigating the nation's intelligence agencies, to probe the Kennedy slaying. Schweiker is a member of the committee.

The magazine quoted Schweiker as saying there are now indications that both the Central Intelligence Agency and the FBI have covered up evidence which could have affected the findings of the Warren Commission.

Schweiker said in the magazine interview that it has come to light recently, through a letter by former FBI Director J. Edger Hoover, that Jack Ruby, who shot Oswald shortly after the Kennedy slaying, was an FBI informer.

And Oswald himself may have had some affiliation with an intelligence operation. the magazine quoted Schweiker as saying

The weekly newsimagazine said Schweiker explained his suspicions about Oswald by noting that while in Japan Oswald was stationed at a base where CIA special agents

"He applied for a hardship discharge because of his mutiver. But he went home to his mother for just a few days and then high-tailed it to Russia. He immediately got a passport to go there and then proceeded to renounce his citizenship. Yet, when he wanted to come back, we gave him back his passport and paid his fare home." Schweiker was quoted as saying.

The FBI had no comment on Schweiker's remarks. A spokesman for the CIA said that a previous check of agency files does not show Oswald as ever having any connec-

The senator also noted that a threatening letter delivered to the FBI by Oswald warning agents not to interview his wife was destroyed after the Kennedy slaying.

FBI Director Clarence Kelley confirmed this recently, and said the incident is under ivestigation.

Two months before JFK death CIA has Oswald recordings

WASHINGTON (AP) — A pair of telephone conversations involving Lee Harvey Oswald were tape recorded by the Central Intelligence Agency less than two months before the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, according to informed sources.

The sources said the conversations were recorded Sept. 27 and 28, 1973, in the course of the CIA's routine monitoring of phone calls to and from the Soviet and Cuban embassies in Mexico City.

Oswald, who was identified by the Warren Commission as the sole killer of Kennedy on Nov. 22, 1963, was in Mexico City attempting to obtain a visa to travel to the Soviet Union via Cuba.

The tapes were routinely processed and filed without any further action until Kennedy was killed, one source said Saturday, with either the actual recordings or transcripts of them then being flown to Washington.


According to Warren Commission documents, the Sept. 27 conversation was between officials of the Cuban and Soviet embassies involving Oswald's visa request.

The Sept. 28 conversation was similar except that Oswald himself, who was then in the Ouban embassy, got on the telephone and spoke in broken Russian to the Soviet official.

The FBI recently acknowledged that a letter threatening an FBI agent was delivered by Oswald to the Dallas FBI office several days before the Kennedy assassination. It said the letter was destroyed and no report of it was ever made to Warren Commission.

It has not been determined whether the commission was informed of the CIA tapes, but an FBI memo it received states that "another U.S. Government agency is in possession of the following information" and proceeds to detail, without naming the source, the content of the two conversations relating to Oswald.

Oswald's trip to Merico City has been considered by some to indicate that he was part of a foreign conspiracy, a proposition which the Warren Commission rejected.
