IF RUBY IS FOUND INSANE NOW HE WILL BE SENT TO A STATE MENTAL HOSPITAL. BUT IF HE IS FOUND SANE, THE APPEALS COURT WOULD REVIEW THE CONVICTION AS SCHEDULED.
