### Ruby to Push Court Fight

DALLAS, March 20 (AP)— Further legal maneuvering was assured today in the bizarre case of Jack Ruby, presumably still in state courts and possibly before the same judge who sentenced him to die. Federal Dist. Judge T. Whitfield Davidson refused yesterday to take jurisdiction in a

sanity trial. Then the condemned slayer of President Kennedy's assassin rose, with the court's permission and delivered a 30-minute lecture on lawyers, conspiracies and sanity—one of his few public utterances since Nov. 24, 1963, when he shot Lee Harvey Oswald.
