DALLAS, March 31, (AP) Jack Ruby, killer of President Kennedy's assassin, said today he had given up hope.

Speaking almost in riddles, the onc-time nightclub oper-ator was asked if he had lost

ator was asked if he had lost hope. "I sure have," Ruby said. Reporters pressed him about whether he expected to be executed in the electric chair, and he would only re-ply. "well, you figure it out." Ruby clearly stated remorse for shooting down Lee Har-vey Oswald on Nov. 24. 1963, two days after Oswald killed the President. AERCU if he regretted

Asken if he regretted shooting Oswald, Ruby said: Yes, Many, many times."

Ruby, who is 55 years old, looked better than he had at most of the court sessions during his trial. His color had improved and he had gained weight. He talked to reporters in his frequently cruptic master

He talked to reporters in his frequently cryptic man-ner as he was brought into court for a hearing. "This is all just a farce," he said.

he said. The hearing was to ques-tion defense lawyers on the reason for their delay in ap-pealing a habcas corpus hearing. Legal maneuvering is being held up pending the appeal to the Texas Criminal Anneals Court Appeals Court.

A jury sentenced Ruby to death but several appeals have been filed.
