SUBJECT: JACK RUBY, aka.

CIVIL RIGHTS

Information has been received from V. P. Schumacher, President, Merchant State Bank, Dallas, Texas, 5217 Ross Street, Dallas, Texas, that Ruby rented a safety deposit box at the bank in 1959. He entered the box eleven times in 1959, three times in 1960, once in 1961. The last entry by Ruby to the box was 3/21/61. Mr. Schumacher advised in view of the circumstances existing concerning Ruby it would require a court order to enter the safety deposit box.

ACTION:

While the contents of the safety deposit box could be of some value concerning our civil rights investigation, in view of the fact state authorities are responsible for prosecution of Ruby for murder, no action should be taken concerning a court order without first discussing same with the District Attorney. If approved, the Dallas Office will be so instructed.
