On 12-2-63 Mrs. LOIS MILBURN, Secretary to the Personnel Officer, Virginia-Carolina Chemical Co., Richmond, advised SA WILSON B. WADDY that WALTER S. LIBBY, JR., 2419 Grove Ave., Richmond, born July 14, 1940, at Summit, N.J. was employed by Virginia-Carolina at Richmond as a technician from 6-12-61 to 9-28-62 when his employment was terminated for medical reasons.

Mrs. MILBURN advised that LIBBY was sent to Charleston, S.C., on an assignment for Virginia-Carolina Chemical Co., around 9-1-62. He left Richmond for Charleston but could not be located thereafter at Charleston. When he returned to Richmond he was [REDACTED] and was discharged from Virginia-Carolina. Mrs. MILBURN exhibited motel receipts, gas receipts, etc., obtained from LIBBY on his return from Charleston. These receipts revealed that LIBBY stayed at the Charleston Heights Motel, Charleston Heights, S.C., 9-3 and 4-63. On these receipts LIBBY had written notes to himself, addressed to "WALT" which were accusations that he was cheating Virginia-Carolina Chemical Co.

The indices of the Richmond Office contain no reference to WALTER STOKES LIBBY, JR.
