POLYGRAPH REPORT

On 11/30/63 JAMES EUGENE FLOYD, JR. was interviewed with the use of the polygraph, in the Warden's Office, at Eastham State Prison, Weldon, Texas, by SA C. RAY HALL, with SA ROBERT J. STEVENS of the Dallas Office and SA ROBERT E. WILTT of the Houston Office present during the interview. FLOYD signed a consent to interview with polygraph on November 30, 1963. This interview was authorized by Inspector JAMES R. HALLLEY, of the Bureau.

During the interview with FLOYD, he was asked relevant questions relating to whether he knew JACK L. RUBY of Dallas, Texas, and whether RUBY had ever asked FLOYD to kill Governor JOHN CONNALLY of Texas. Significant emotional responses were recorded by the polygraph, when FLOYD was asked whether he intended to answer questions truthfully; whether he ever knew JACK L. RUBY, or whether RUBY ever asked FLOYD to kill Governor JOHN CONNALLY. FLOYD answered yes to all these questions. The responses recorded by the polygraph were not those normally expected of an innocent person telling the truth.

When questioned concerning these responses, FLOYD admitted that JACK L. RUBY had never asked him to kill Governor JOHN CONNALLY or any other person, and RUBY had never paid FLOYD any money for anything. FLOYD claimed, however, that in March, 1960, he and his first wife MARY KATYERINE (who is now Mrs. IRA CAVINESS of Dallas, Texas) were living on Center Street in Dallas, Texas. He made a trip to Alabama with his father and returned to Dallas unexpectedly. A man whom his wife said was JACK RUBY came by his house, expecting to have a date with FLOYD's wife and FLOYD ran the man off. That night, according to FLOYD, FLOYD's wife asked him to commit an unnatural oral sex act on her. Because of this request, he assumed that RUBY had engaged in this act with FLOYD's wife, during the time FLOYD was in Alabama, although his wife never told him that this occurred. FLOYD said that this one time was the only time he had ever seen the man believed to be JACK RUBY. For this reason, after he had seen on television and read in the newspapers, the story about RUBY killing OSWALD, he decided to do something to get even with RUBY, and made up this fictitious story that RUBY had paid him to kill Governor CONNALLY. Following this admission, FLOYD was very emotional, and stated he did not want to be interviewed further with the polygraph.
