AT CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

[redacted] (protect identity), owner of [redacted] Chicago, advised SA'S JOSEPH G. SHEA and WILLIAM A MEINCKE, on November 25, 1963, that he has known RUBY for many years. He stated RUBY, when in Chicago, was a small-time salesman and ticket scalper. He said that RUBY had never engaged in any major gambling ventures, nor was he a bookmaker. In 1946, RUBY was associated with a novelty firm called Ruby Products.

[redacted] recalled that RUBY had a sister, name unknown, in Dallas who was operating a tavern in that city. In about 1946, RUBY left Chicago to assist his sister in the management of this tavern.

[redacted] indicated that he has had infrequent contacts with RUBY since 1946 but is aware that RUBY had many close friends among the Dallas Police Department personnel. He recalls RUBY making trips to Hot Springs, Arkansas, with the Dallas Chief of Police but indicated that he did not recall when these trips were made and would not know if the trips were with the present Chief of Police. According to [redacted], RUBY had a hot temper and was very quick to engage in fights. He stated that RUBY had absolutely no connections with the criminal element in Chicago. He recalled that two of RUBY's closest friends were HERSHEY and SEPTKE SHER. These brothers operate a wholesale meat business in the Chicago Fulton Market area.

[REDACTED] advised SA DENNIS W. SHANAHAN, on 11/25/63, that he overheard a conversation on the evening of 11/24/63, to the effect that the individuals from Chicago who attempted to take over the gambling interest in the Dallas area in 1947 had conducted their meetings at RUBY's bar in Dallas on the second floor. This informant did not know the identity of the individuals conducting this conversation and had no knowledge of his own as to its veracity.

During the course of this conversation, this informant learned that one Deputy Sheriff (FNU) TOMACELLI (PH), of the Cook County Sheriff's Office, was a person who was well acquainted with subject RUBY.

Investigation at Cook County Sheriff's Office reflects no one named TOMACELLI is an investigative Deputy Sheriff.

Records are now being obtained at Chicago reflecting roster of civilian process servers of Cook County Sheriff's Office in effort to identify TOMACELLI.

IRWIN WEINER, American Bail Bonding Company, 1019 South State Street, Chicago, Illinois, was interviewed by SA LEONARD A. WOLF on November 27, 1963, and admitted that he knew JACK RUBENSTEIN and stated that he did not want to discuss with anyone his knowledge of RUBENSTEIN. It was pointed out to WEINER that this matter concerned the killing of the President and LEE OSWALD and certainly did not involve him or his associates. WEINER stated that he realized this but that he still did not wish to discuss RUBENSTEIN, and advised that any information he had concerning RUBENSTEIN would not be material to the Bureau's investigation. It is to be noted that WEINER is an associate of numerous low and high caliber notorious Chicago hoodlums.

GEORGE RICKETTS, the Co-owner of Ricketts Restaurant, 1007 North Clark Street, Chicago, advised SAs LLOYD H. NELSON and JERRY H. BREIDENFELD on November 26, 1963, that he does not know JACK RUBY or JACK RUBENSTEIN. RICKETTS stated that when he first heard the news he thought JACK RUBY was HARRY RUBENSTEIN who owned the Olympic Hotel at 1015 North Clark Street, Chicago, and who ran several strip joints. He advised that he subsequently determined that HARRY RUBENSTEIN is not identical with JACK RUBY.

AT DALLAS, TEXAS:

At 12:30 PM, November 25, 1963, SAC J. GORDON SHANKLIN telephonically advised SA JOHN J. FLANAGAN on duty at the Chief of Police's Office, Dallas Police Department, and that he had received a telephone call from the Oklahoma City Office. In this call SA FLANAGAN was informed that JACK PURDIE, Chief of Police, Tulsa, Oklahoma, had received a telephone call at 12:05 PM that date from GEORGE MARTIN, News Director, KVOO-TV, Tulsa, Oklahoma, who said that CARL BOYE, station newsman, had received a call from a muffled voice, stating, "There will be two assassinations in Washington, D. C. today and also the Chief of Police in Dallas will be assassinated today."

At the time this telephone call was received from SAC SHANKLIN at his request, Officer A. H. HAMMETT of the Dallas Police Department was on another extension and received the above information. Chief JESSE CURRY was absent at the time since he had left the Department to proceed to the funeral of his police officer who had been killed shortly after the assassination of President KENNEDY.

Officer HAMMETT stated he would furnish this information by radio to Chief CURRY and would institute other proper precautions.

At 12:35 PM, Officer HAMMETT advised SA FLANAGAN that he had in fact, notified Chief CURRY of the foregoing and had ascertained that the Chief was alone in the automobile. Officer HAMMETT said that he had also advised that Assistant Chief of Police M. W. STEVENSON, who had dispatched officers to the vicinity where the Chief of Police CURRY was. He said these officers would stay with Chief CURRY throughout the rest of the day.

At approximately 5:00 PM, Inspector PUTNAM of the Dallas Police Department advised that subsequent to the threat on Chief CURRY's life, officers had at all times formed a cordon around the Chief when he was out of his automobile. He said that no untoward incident had occurred.

Mrs. C. L. CONNELL, 6949 Lake Shore Drive, during the course of interview on November 29, 1963, by SA NORMAN W. PROPST, advised she had a conversation a few days previously with an acquaintance named MARY PICK, a secretary for the law firm of Akin, Vial, Hamilton, Kock and Tubb, of Dallas. PICK told CONNELL that she recalled JACK RUBY visiting one of the attorneys of that firm approximately a week prior to the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY for the purpose of designating his power of attorney. According to CONNELL, PICK did not recall which attorney RUBY consulted or to whom the power of attorney was designated. PICK did recall, however, that RUBY had invited her to visit the Carousel Club.

[REDACTED] advised the records of the Michigan Bell Telephone Company 1366 Cass Avenue revealed that Detroit telephone numbers UN 3-0400 and UN 3-5590 are the published and unpublished numbers respectively for COBO Cleaners, 18135 Livernois, Detroit, which service was established in October 26, 1961, for both numbers. COBO Cleaners is operated by EARL R. RUBY, brother of JACK RUBY.

The Southfield Michigan telephone number EL 6-0919 was issued to EARL R. RUBY, 19359 West Eleven Mile Road, Southfield. This service was established during September 19, 1962, and was discontinued on October 16, 1963, EARL RUBY then obtained telephone number 353-2730 at his new residence, 29925 Woodland Drive, Southfield.

The above information cannot be made public except upon the issuance of subpoena duces tecum issued to the commercial manager, Michigan Bell Telephone Company, 1365 Cass Avenue, Detroit 26, Michigan.

The following investigation was conducted by IC GERALD J. JASZCZ on November 29, 1963.

The records of the Detroit and Southfield Police Departments and the Wayne County Sheriff's Office failed to contain any record for COBO Cleaners or EARL R. RUBY.

The records of the Merchants Credit Bureau and Dun and Bradstreet both Detroit, revealed COBO Cleaners and EARL R. RUBY possess excellent credit ratings. These records failed to contain any derogatory information or detrimental legal information.

[REDACTED] (protect identity), former Dallas County, Texas, gambler and since 1947 local Las Vegas gambler, advised SAs CARL F. FREEMAN and RONALD L. MALEY, on November 25, 1963, that he does not know RUBENSTEIN; however, he has heard since the shooting of OSWALD that RUBENSTEIN has in the recent past gambled and stayed at the Tropicana Hotel in Las Vegas. [REDACTED] further advised that RUBENSTEIN is acquainted with WILLIAM RICE, a pitboss at the Tropicana Hotel. [REDACTED] stated he could furnish no further information concerning this matter; however, if he hears of anything pertaining to RUBENSTEIN, he will furnish the same to the local FBI Office.

[REDACTED] advised on 11/28/63, that this telephone is listed to BILL MILLER, 6675 Whitley Terrace, Los Angeles, CALIF.

IC GERALD H. BOSWELL ascertained that the records of the Retail Merchant's Credit Association as of 11/29/63, reflected no identifiable record of MILLER. IC PAUL H. CHAMBERLAIN ascertained there is no identifiable record of MILLER in the files of the Los Angeles Police Department and Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office.

Dallas teletype to Albany 11/28/63, disclosed telephone call from RUBY's telephone to telephone number CR 1-9722.

[REDACTED] advised on 11/28/63, that this telephone is listed to TED LEFF, 337 North Oakhurst, Beverly Hills, CALIF.

IC GERALD H. BOSWELL ascertained on 11/29/63, through the records of the Retail Merchant's Credit Association that TED LEFF and his divorced wife FLORETTE, lived or did live at 337 North Oakhurst, Beverly Hills. They previously resided at 1550 Via Norte, Palm Springs, California. No other pertinent information was noted.

IC PAUL CHAMBERLAIN ascertained on 11/29/63, there was no identifiable record of LEFF in the files of the Los Angeles Police Department and Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office.

Dallas tel 11/28/63, disclosed a call from RUBY's telephone to number 526-4356, Simi, California.

[REDACTED] advised on 11/28/63, that this telephone is listed to RONALD DENNIS MAGID, 1294 Agnew Street, Santa Susana, California.

IC BOSWELL on 11/29/63, ascertained at the Retail Merchant's Credit Association that MAGID, wife GERTRUDE, reside at Simi, California, and he is employed as a salesman or a sales manager by the W. C. Dillon Company, Van Nuys, California.

ANDRIST on 11/26/63, that he frequents a bowling alley located on the corner where the Worthington Dodge Company, 2771 East Slauson Avenue, is located. He said the bowling alley has a cafe in it. A waitress works there who has told him she knew RUBY personally. She said that RUBY allegedly had two partners, one BILLY JENKINS, who allegedly owned two restaurants in Fort Worth, and another whose name she could not recall. She said they were all from Chicago. On 11/29/63, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] advised SAs ROBERT L. SCHARF and DAVID A. O'CONNOR, that she does not want to testify in any legal proceeding. She insisted her name be kept completely confidential.

She stated she has resided in the Los Angeles area for about five years. Prior to this, she lived and worked in Fort Worth, Texas.

While in Texas, she was married to [REDACTED] JR., from whom she is now divorced. Child support money which he owes her is overdue and she does not know his current address. She said he can be located through her brother, [REDACTED]

She said her former husband associated with JACK RUBY (RUBENSTEIN) during 1951 - 1958 when he, [REDACTED] was still living with her in Fort Worth. She said they were close friends and fellow poker players.

For some reason, which BLISS did not know, [REDACTED] was assaulted and injured by "one of RUBY's boys" in 1956. She did not know the assailant's name.

While in Fort Worth, [REDACTED] lived at [REDACTED] Avenue in late 1956 and prior to that lived at [REDACTED] Avenue. In 1956, RUBY and a girl friend known to her only as MARJORIE came to see [REDACTED] at the latter address. [REDACTED] described MARJORIE as a white, female, in her late 20's. 5'3" tall, 125 pounds, black hair, brown eyes, with no known employment.

[REDACTED] told [REDACTED] around 1954 - 1955 that RUBY had been paying off Dallas Police Officers for years, and as a result, his places of entertainment was never raided. She had no first hand information about this allegation.

Her ex-husband told her that RUBY struck girls who angered him, but she had no specific data in this connection.

Another associate of [REDACTED] and RUBY was one BILL JENKINS, aka Bill Pearson, who operated a night club in Fort Worth which was blown up around 1954 or 1955 by a man named TINY EAGLESTON (phonetic). She heard that hoodlum elements were responsible for this. She said that JENKINS drove a black bulletproof Cadillac. He was formerly affiliated with a stock car race track in Fort Worth.

[REDACTED] was acquainted with a MURRAY MEASEIO (phonetic) of Galveston, Texas, who was an associate of RUBY. MEASEIO reportedly operated slot machines in night clubs.

[REDACTED] said she understood that all of the above persons, except GEORGE, came from Chicago, Illinois originally.

She said her ex-husband has a police record, having been in trouble in Fort Worth, Texas, Little Rock, Arkansas, Hot Springs, Arkansas, and Vallejo, California. She said that [REDACTED] was born in 1919. His father, [REDACTED], was, prior to his death, an attorney in Little Rock, Arkansas.

She knew nothing about RUBY's background other than his associates as noted above. She knew of no subversive connections of RUBY, nor did she know anything about the Fair Play for Cuba Committee. None of the above mentioned persons expressed any radical or extreme political viewpoints to her knowledge.

She furnished no additional pertinent information, and insisted her identity be absolutely protected.



It was ascertained through [redacted] that Telephone No. HO 6-8211 is listed to Reprise Records, 1347 Cahuenga Blvd.; BR 2-9836 is listed to MICHAEL SHORE, 109 North Almont Drive and CR 4-0043 is also listed to MICHAEL SHORE.

ALLIF IC GERALD A. BOSWELL ascertained through the records of the Retail Merchants Credit Association that MICHAEL B. SHORE and wife, JEAN, reside at 109 North Almont Drive, Los Angeles. No information of pertinence appears in the credit records.

IC PAUL H. CHAMBERLAIN, JR. ascertained there are no identifiable records in the files of the Los Angeles Police Department or Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office concerning SHORE.

The following is a summary of the information pertaining to Reprise Records and its principals as taken from the files of the Los Angeles Office. It is noted that MICHAEL SHORE is employed by the Reprise Records, 1347 Cahuenga and results of interview with him are set forth in the FD 302 dated 11/27/63 by SAs CHARLES B. SULLIVAN and CLAUDE E. WILLIS.

On 3/1/63, [redacted] - PCI, advised SAs AMEDEE O. RICHARDS, JR. and JOHN P. COSTIN, JR., that SAM LAINE, brother of singer FRANKIE LAINE, has said that their real name is LOVECCHIO and they are Sicilians, having grown up in the Chicago district before coming to the West Coast. LAINE said he had taken a promotion job with Reprise Records, which is operated by FRANK SINATRA. Promotion records which have been released by Reprise include such new singers as

RONNIE SCALIAR, TIMMY WELCH and NANCY SINATRA, daughter of FRANK SINATRA.

On 9/19/63, [REDACTED] in discussing MAX WEINBERG, designated as Top Jewel Theft subject, advised SAs DONALD A. SCHLAEFER, and WILLIE R. WHITE and Supervisor CHESTER E. ST. VINCENT, that WEINBERG's daughter is presently employed as a secretary for Reprise Records owned by FRANK SINATRA. She received this job through a distributor, MEL (LNU).

[REDACTED] further advised that he had heard that people in the Reprise office were calling all over the country and placing large bets. No details or names relative to this type of activity were available to LA 4429-C.

On 6/28/63, MICHAEL SHORE of Reprise Records, 1347 Cahuenga, Los Angeles, California, Telephone No. HO 6-8211, advised SAA CHARLES E. STINE that he had seen publicity in the Los Angeles papers concerning the conviction of MARVIN R. COLE on Obstruction of Justice charges. He commented that he had known COLE for a long time and that "MARVIN COLE is DOC STACHER's boy". SHORE stated that he had been, in some measure, responsible for starting COLE out in business in New York City a number of years ago. He indicated that on one occasion he had loaned money to COLE in order that COLE might buy points in the Fremont Hotel and Gambling Casino in Las Vegas, Nevada.

On 10/18/63 MARVIN R. COLE was indicted by the Federal Grand Jury at Los Angeles, charging him with two counts of violation of Obstruction of Justice. Trial commenced in U. S. District Court, Los Angeles 5/14/63. On 5/23/63 the jury returned a verdict of guilty on both counts. On 6/12/63, a fine of \$1,000 on each of the two counts was imposed by the court. Notice of Appeal was filed by COLE's attorneys on 6/13/63.

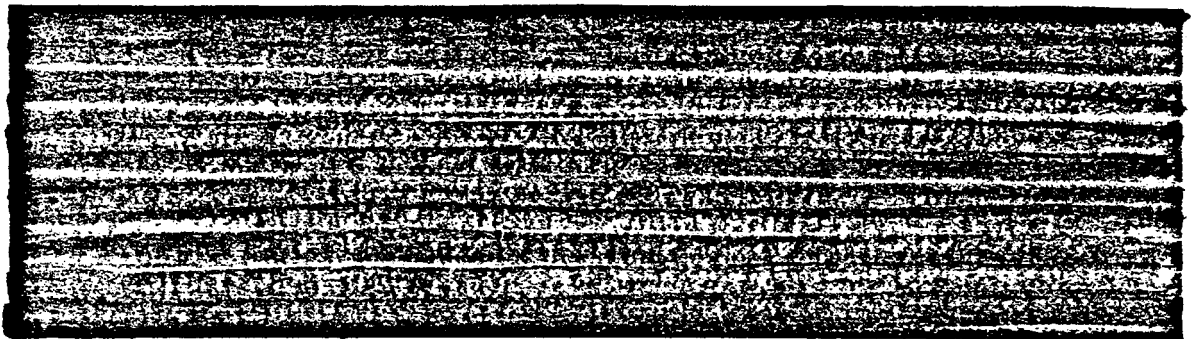

Advertising Register under the advertising firm of Cole, Fischer & Rogow, Inc., listed MARVIN R. COLE as Chairman of the Board, Secretary and Treasurer.



The "Hollywood Reporter", a daily publication devoted to the entertainment industry, in its issue of 10/4/63, appeared an article reflecting that FRANK SINATRA had been named "Special Assistant to the President" by JACK L. WARNER, President of Warner Bros. This article states that SINATRA will be involved in all aspects of the Warner Bros. corporate activity and the appointment confirmed speculation that started when WARNERS negotiated the affiliation of FRANK SINATRA's Reprise Records with Warner Bros. Records.

The "Los Angeles Times", a Los Angeles daily newspaper, in its issue of 10/7/63, contained an article captioned, "SINATRA Must Answer Nevada Charge Today". This article datelined Las Vegas states in part as follows:

"FRANK SINATRA must reply today to State Gaming Control Board charges that he entertained mob boss, SAM GIANCANA at his Lake Tahoe casino, the Cal Neva, last July...

"The control board, which filed its charges 9/11/63 in Carson City, asked the State Gaming Commission to revoke SINATRA's Cal-Neva gaming license for violating state gambling regulations. It bases its request on the fact that GIANCANA, a Chicago-based gang chieftain, is one of 11 hoodlums banned from Nevada hotels and casinos as undesirables".

The 'Los Angeles Times' in its issue of 10/8/63 contained an article captioned "SINATRA to Pull Out of Nevada Gambling Field". This article states in part as follows:

"FRANK SINATRA, in a surprise announcement Monday, said he will surrender his rich Nevada gambling interests rather than engage in a legal wrangle to retain them.."

This article goes on to state that SINATRA is the principal owner of the Cal-Neva Lodge, Lake Tahoe, which is valued at \$3,000,000 and also holds 9% of the Sands, Las Vegas - an interest worth about \$380,000.

California, furnished the following information to SA JOSEPH R. CONLON on 11/30/63.

He is a police reporter for the [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] California.

[REDACTED] he was assigned by the paper to go to Dallas and write "atmosphere stories" of the reactions of the citizens in Dallas to the assassination of President KENNEDY. [REDACTED] arrived in Dallas on Friday, 11/22/63 at about 9:30 p.m.

Whenever he went to the Dallas Police Building he had to present his press pass to gain entry to the building. By way of security he had to show his pass before ascending any flight of stairs and upon his arrival at each floor in the Police Building.

He confided he was not physically present in the basement of the Police Building at the time OSWALD was shot. During this event he was having breakfast at [REDACTED] in Dallas. He was the only representative of the [REDACTED] in Dallas and it was impossible for him to be present at the various places throughout the city where noteworthy news events were occurring. He wrote the story of the circumstances of OSWALD's shooting as if he were there as he witnessed the event on television and later obtained other pertinent information from other reporters. He did this to give his paper prestige as few Southern California papers were represented in Dallas. [REDACTED] city editor was aware of what he had done, but it was [REDACTED] known to the owner or executive editor of the paper. [REDACTED] made this disclosure to the Bureau because of the deep admiration and respect he had for the Bureau and its work and requested the disclosure be kept in confidence.

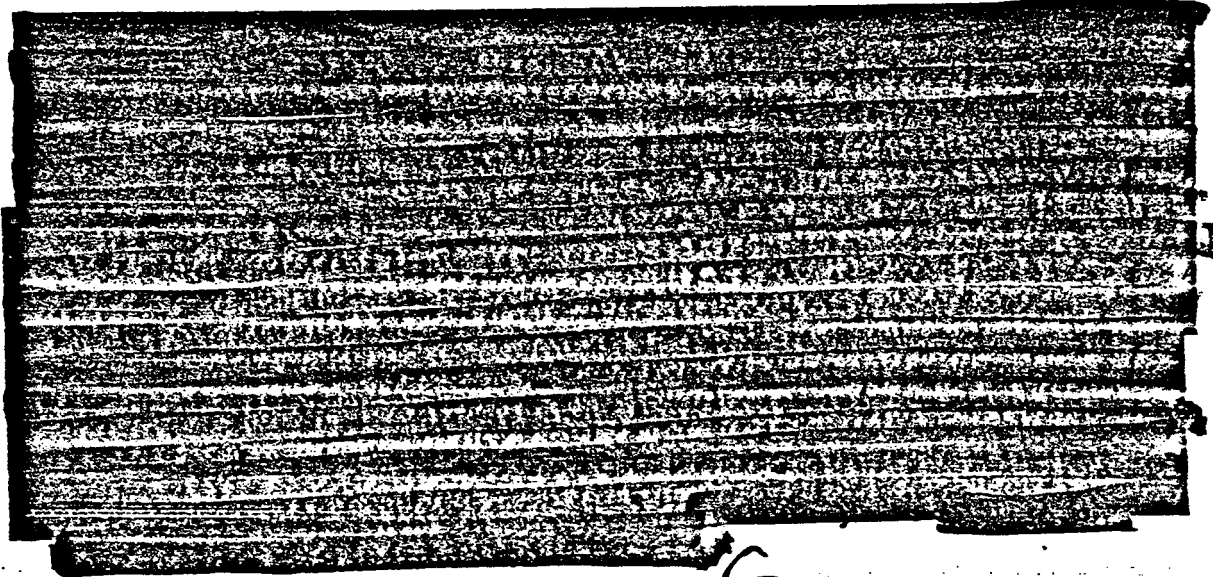

The only time he caught a glimpse of RUBY was after he was brought to the third floor of the Police Building in Dallas and was taken to a restroom during the course of police interrogation.

An Oklahoma City, Oklahoma source, [REDACTED] furnished the following information: (protect identity);

He became acquainted with JACK RUBY approximately two and one-half years ago and for a period of approximately two years he frequented the club in Dallas, Texas, operated by JACK RUBY. During this time he became well acquainted with RUBY. His only contact with RUBY was at RUBY's club and never visited with RUBY at the latter's apartment and was not acquainted with any of RUBY's relatives.

Source described RUBY as an egotistical individual who desires publicity and personal recognition. RUBY's behavior is peculiar in that he sometimes loses his temper over small matters. He is known to befriend anyone he likes and on several occasions has befriended source, furnishing source financial assistance on one occasion. Source has heard rumors among show people in Dallas that RUBY is a "queer" but has no personal knowledge to substantiate this rumor.

According to source, the person who is best acquainted with RUBY is RAY (last name unknown) a Negro bartender in RUBY's club in Dallas. Source has heard that RAY was acquainted with RUBY prior to the time RUBY came to Dallas.

According to the source, a dancer at the Theater Lounge or Colony Club in Dallas, named TOY REVEL (true name LINDA COOK) has known and has been closely associated with RUBY. NIKKI JOYE, (true name MAXINE JOYE WILLIAMS) a dancer at the Theater Lounge, has been acquainted with RUBY for several years. NIKKI JOYE hates RUBY for some unknown reason and will not perform at RUBY's club.

GENE FLETCHER, JACK TODD and PAUL COLE frequent RUBY's club in Dallas and have been observed by source on several occasions having conferences with RUBY in his office. Source described FLETCHER as former owner of the Club Dallas;

TODD as a known hoodlum and COLE as a gambler and pimp. FLETCHER, TODD and COLE are close associates and source has heard rumors that they have some connection with the Teamsters' Union.

Source has never known RUBY to have any interest in either local or national politics or political figures. Source has never heard RUBY make any remark which would indicate he had any connection with or any sympathy toward any subversive organization.

Source advised he has seen photographs of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and stated this person was unknown to him and to his knowledge OSWALD had no association with RUBY.

In the past RIAFF has been very cooperative with the St. Louis Office in furnishing information requested from him which has generally been in the nature of theatrical booking information. In the past he has also furnished information which has resulted in apprehending FBI fugitives.
