RE: JACK LEON RUBY;  
LEE HARVEY OSWALD -  
VICTIM (Deceased)

H. R. NIEMAN, JR., retired U. S. Navy *Admiral*,  
Executive Director, Texas State Building Commission, Austin,  
Texas, home address - 60 Falcones Drive, advised on  
December 4, 1963, the following:

NIEMAN in the early 1950s was Commanding Officer  
of the Naval Air Station in Dallas, Texas. He recalls that  
a young Naval officer, CHARLES LEON NAGLE, during  
1961 was found in an unconscious state at the foot of some  
stairs leading from the Colonial Club, *a night spot in Dallas*.  
Texas. NAGLE was hospitalized and NIEMAN *conducted an*  
investigation.

The assassination of President KENNEDY and  
subsequent murder by JACK RUBY caused NIEMAN to recall the  
incident. He believes that RUBY was working at/or Manager of  
the Colonial Club at the time of above incident and that  
this club's present name is the Carousel Club.

NAGLE is presently Commander, U. S. Navy, assigned  
Office of the Comptroller of the Navy, Washington, D.C.
