Mr. Johnson:

As a highly outraged and incensed citizen, I insist that you see to it that the bodies of the deceased offspring of the late John F. Kennedy be removed IMMEDIATELY from Arlington National Cemetery.

I understand that Arlington was created by Congress specifically for the burial of persons who had, at some time, served in the Armed Forces of the United States. Obviously, the children referred to never qualified.

I have also written a letter to Attorney General Kennedy on this matter, as I understand it is his duty to prosecute all those who violate federal law. I shall expect to be notified by one of you upon the removal of the subject coffins and contents.

Frankly, I would gladly withdraw this objection and demand if you would guarantee to inter ALL Kennedys there by the end of next week. Otherwise, I shall have to insist upon all or nothing at all.
