Enclosed are the original and one verifax copy of an Editorial which appeared in the "Dallas Times Herald, 11-26-63, and of the reprint by this newspaper of an Editorial which appeared in the "New York Times" issue of 11-25-63.

It is observed the "New York Times", is critical of the Dallas, Texas, Police Department for its failure to adequately protect OSWALD and publicity attendant to OSWALD's transfer from Dallas City Jail to Dallas County Jail, as well as of alleged statements of the Chief of Police (JESSE E. CURRY, NA) and District Attorney (HENRY WADE, former SA, FBI), which in effect pronounced OSWALD guilty before trial. It is admitted Dallas authorities were "abetted and encouraged" by newspapers, radio and TV.

The "Dallas Times Herald" editorial in turn, takes the position the press must share the blame with the police. Chief of Police CURRY's actions are defended to the extent that they were "motivated by the best of intentions",
