SUBJECT: JACK LEON RUBY
Lee Harvey Oswald - Victim
CIVIL RIGHTS

SAC Shanklin, Dallas, called at 11:20 a.m. to advise that at 10:10 a.m. (11:10 a.m. our time), a deputy sheriff called with a subpoena for the two agents who interviewed Ruby at the jail in the presence of his attorney. These two agents are C. Ray Hall, and Manning Clements. The subpoena was issued by the defense in connection with the hearing scheduled for 10 a.m., Dallas time, re release of Ruby on bail.

Mr. Shanklin supposed that the purpose of the subpoena was to indicate that Ruby was cooperating with the FBI during the interview. Shanklin proposed that the agents appear but not answer any questions except that they did interview Ruby and he did answer questions. No specifics of the interview would be given. Mr. Shanklin also suggested that the US Attorney be notified so that he could appear in court with the agents to object to inappropriate questions.

I told Shanklin to go ahead and proceed on this basis.
