He said he heard OSWALD speak to someone on the telephone on one occasion but he spoke in what he thought was the Russian language and he assumed OSWALD was talking to his wife. He said that OSWALD did not associate with anybody at the rooming house, to his knowledge, and had no visitors. He said he never heard OSWALD mention JACK RUBY or mention visiting the Carousel Club.

MR & MRS. HANK KILLAM

He advised that although he was acquainted with WANDA JOYCE KILLAM and her husband HANK and knew that WANDA worked for JACK RUBY, he had never met RUBY and had never heard of RUBY until the shooting of OSWALD. He stated he had never been in the Carousel Club and would not even know the address.

JOHN J. BANNIGAN, 428 Euclid Avenue, advised on December 19, 1963, that he is the husband of TERESA BANNIGAN. He said she is employed in the offices of attorneys Cahill - Gordon, 70 Pine Street, New York City, working from 6:00 p.m. until about 6:00 a.m. He said she gets home at 8:00 a.m. and sleeps all day. He said his wife is a prolific letter writer and that she had written President KENNEDY numerous times. He said she has also written Cabinet members concerning the handling of Government policies. He said she has also corresponded with Senator CLIFFORD P. CASE and Representative JAMES C. AUCHINCLOSS, of New Jersey. He said Mrs. BANNIGAN wrote editorials for New Jersey Governor HUGHES on his current bond issue and that she had received a letter of congratulations from Governor HUGHES on the fine work she did.

He said his wife is not an attorney but has been employed by the above law firm for 20 years and knows all the answers concerning law.

He said that recently she sued the City of Manasquan and he produced an article from "The Coast Star", Manasquan paper, December, 1963, issue, which reflected "Manasquan Wins Suit - Mrs. Bannigan Loses Court Action Aimed at Upsetting Beach Rate Ordinance." This article states that Superior Court Judge J. EDWARD KNIGHT has upheld the validity of Manasquan's beach rate adopted April 16, 1962.

In a written opinion in a suit brought by Mrs. JOHN J. BANNIGAN, 428 Euclid Avenue, Judge KNIGHT declared the code is not discriminatory.

Mrs. BANNIGAN had termed the ordinance unethical, undemocratic, and unconstitutional. She specifically attacked the measure because it stipulated that season beach badges at \$4.00 are available only through May 31. After that date, June-July badges and August-September badges may be bought at \$4.00 each.
