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The following letter was postmarked Wichita Falls, Texas, November 27, 1963, addressed to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Dallas, Texas:

> "32A Childress 11-27-63

"Dear Sirs:

"Last Sunday, my husband and I, took a ride to Dallas to see the spot where our beloved President was assassinated. Later on we walked over to the jail house where Oswald was shot & stood among the many people who where there. My husband walked over to this man who was sitting on the stone wall with a radio to hear the later developments. The man with the radio said, Iwasn't surprised to hear about the killing of the President, for that was the strong rumor for the past month here in Dallas. They said they would shoot him if he visited this city. He went on to say he was surprised Jack Ruby shot Oswald, for six or eight days ago, Oswald was in the 'Carousal Night Club' talking to Ruby and they appeared real friendly. He said Oswald went there often. .

"Maybe this bit of information is just loose talk, but I choose not to ignore it.

The following investigation was conducted by SA WILLIAM E. LOGG, JR. at Wichita Falls, Texas.

On December 6, 1963, Mrs. MARGAURITE TILTON, 32A Childress, wife of Staff Sergeant, JOHN R. FILTON, was contacted by SA WILLIAM B. LOGG, JR.

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Mrs. TILTON reiterated the information furnished in her letter of November 27, 1963. She stated both she and her husband had talked to the man who had stated he had seen OSWALD talking to RUBY in the Carousel Club. Mrs. TILTON advised, however, neither she nor her husband obtained this man's name nor did she have any other means of identifying him. She advised he was a white male, about 40 to 42, approximately 5'4", stocky build, dark receding hair. She advised he did remark that he was from Dallas and had lived in Dallas for sometime. Mrs. TILTON was unable to furnish any other identifying information concerning this man.

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Mrs. M. F. TOBIAS, SR., manager, apartment building, 603-604 Elsbeth, Dallas, Texas, advised that she had previously furnished information that L. H. OSWALD had resided in Apartment 2 of 604 Elsbeth from November 3, 1962, until March 3, 1963. She stated that at that time she also furnished information that GEORGE (LNU) visited apartment 22 at 604 Elsbeth, Dallas, Texas, in a convertible automobile, possibly a Chevrolet, and moved Mrs. OSWALD and her young daughter out of apartment 2 sometime around the last day of November or the first day of December, 1962. Mrs. OSWALD, however, was only gone for approximately one week before she returned. She advised that she has since seen a photograph of JACK GUBY in a Dallas newspaper and felt there might be a possibility that RUBY might be identical with the person named GEORGE. She was shown a photograph of JACK RUBY taken on. November 24, 1963. She stated she could not identify RUBY as being GEORGE from this photograph, however, he does resemble this min GEORGE. She stated that she would have to see RUBY in person to either identify or eliminate him.

Mrs. TOBIAS advised there are no tenants presently residing in the building at 604 Elsbeth ...who would have resided in that building when L. H. OSWALD did from November 3, 1962, to March 3, 1963. OSWALD definitely moved either on March 3, 1963, or the day before or day after. When he moved he moved to 214 W. Meely Street, which is only about 11 blecks away. There are four apartments in the building at 604 Elsbeth where OSWALD resided. These apartments are numbered 1 - 4. Residing in apartment #1 which is located on the same floor as apartment #2 where OSWALD resided when OSWALD moved in was BEVERLY and GLENN BOLTON. The BOLTONs however, only resided there until about November 17, 1962, when they moved out of town. She believes that BOLTON's father is 'Mr. A. G. BOLTON, SR., Dallas, Texas, telephone # AX 8-2510.

Mr. ALAN TURNER, on or about November 24, 1962, moved into apartment #1 and was still residing in apartment #1 when the OSWALDs moved. TURNER she believes now resides in California but he did not leave any forwarding address with her.

JACK TUCKER was residing in apartment #3 which is located on the second floor of the building on November 3, 1962, when OSWALD moved into this building in apartment 2. TUCKER moved on December 16, 1962, but did not leave any type of a forwarding

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address and she has no idea where he might be at this time.

And LUCY ZEMBOWER moved into apartment #3 and resided in this apartment until February 9, 1963 when LUCY moved to apartment 6 in the other building. CARL at that time was not still residing with LUCY. Apartment #3 then was vacant until after OSWALD moved. She stated that LUCY ZENBOWER moved later to some unknown address. After LUCY moved CARL came back to the apartment looking for LUCY. CARL at that time told Mrs. TOBIAS that he and LUCY were not married and that the name ZEMBOWER was actually the name of LUCY. She did not learn the last name of CARL and could not advise where he or LUCY could be located.

ALAN TURNER, who is previously set out as being in apartment #1, was on November 3, 1962, residing in apartment #4 and resided in #4 until November 24, 1962, when he moved to apartment #1. Apart-ment #4 was vacant until about December 17, 1962, when a G. W. WELLS moved to this apartment. WELLS resided in this apartment until about January 8, 1963, when he moved into apartment #6 in another building. She believes that WELLS has now left the city and she has no idea where he might be at this time.

1. 10 RUSSELL ATKINS moved into apartment #4 on January 28, 1963, and was still residing in #4 when OSWALD moved on March 3, 1963. ATKINS has now moved and she has no idea where he is at this time. She stated the Texas State Police did come to his apartment looking for him after he moved but she could not furnish any information as to why they were looking for him.

She stated that she could not furnish any information regarding the whereabouts of any of the above persons other than that set out above. She stated the owner of the apartment building, Mrs. W. M. JUREK, 9211 Hathaway Street, Dallas, Texas, telephone EN 1-0763, has the information cards which were filled out by the above tenants and these cards might give some background information which might assist in locating them.

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ARINA OSWALD was interviewed at 11611 Farrar

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She advised that in the late fall of 1962 when she and OSWALD were living at the Elsbeth Street address in Dallas, they had a guarrel. MARINA decided to move away from OSWALD. She contacted GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT, who have a came out to the Elsbeth Street address in his convertible and took MARINA, her daughter JUNE, and a few baby things to the ANNA MELLER house at 5930's La Vista. OSWALD was supposed to come to the MELLER house where they could talk over their domestic problems, but he did not. Later the same day, GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT took MARINA back to the Elsbeth Street address, where she packed up some belongings. GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT then took her back to the MELLER house. She stayed there about six days with ANNA MELLER, and then stayed for a while with KATHY FORD, the wife of MAIMA DECLAR FORD, who lives at 14057 Brookcrest. DRIAN

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MART LAWRENCE, 4425 Chestnut, Mesquite, Texas, employed e Hoad Walbress, Night Shift, Lucas B'& B Restaurant, 3520 Oaklawn, Dallas, Texas, furnished the following information:

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The has been employed as Kead Waitress at the Lucas R & B Restaurant, Dallas, for approximately five months each year during the past eight years. During this period, she has known JACK RUBY as a customer at Lucas B & B Restaurant. He would come into the restaurant several nights each week, usually during the early morning hours. She has seen JACK RUBY in the restaurant with a number of different people, both men and women, but she is not acquainted with and does not know the names of any of RUBY's associates. LAWRENCE is also acquainted with RUBY's sister, Mrs. EVA GRANT, who has been a customer frequently at the B & B Restaurant during the past eight years.

On Friday, November 22, 1963, at approximately 1:30 AM, a young man described as white, in his 20 s, 5'7" - 9", medium build, 140 lbs., dark hair, came inco the restaurant and sat down at a table and when approached stated he was waiting for Mr. RUBY, who would be in in a few minutes. About 2:15 or 2:33 AM, November 22, 1963, JACK RUBY came into the B & B Restaurant and, after looking at the young man at the table, sat down at a table behind the cash register. He did not order his usual food, stating he didn't feel good and ordered a large glass of orange juice. A few minutes later, the young man who was seated at the table went over to RUBY's table. Thereafter, RUBY paid the bill for both himself and the young man who had eaten. Mrs. LAWRENCE had never seen this young man in the-restaurant before nor had she ever seen a him with JACK RUBY prior to this occasion. On November 22, 1963, after the assassination of President KENNEDY and after the arrest of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, Mrs. LAWRENCE saw OSWALD on television and stated the photograph of OSWALD on television appeared very similar to the young man who was with JACK RUBY in the B &B Restaurant earlier on the morning of November 22, 1963. Subsequently, Mrs. LAWRENCE and BOBBY (LNU), the cashier on the night shift at the B & B Restaurant, discussed the young man who was with

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 RUBY on the early morning of November 22, 1963, and they agreed that he appeared very similar to LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

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Mrs. LAWRENCE was shown a photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and she stated the young man who was with JACK RUBY in the B & B Restaurant on the early morning of November 22, 1963, was similar in description and appearance to LEE HARVEY OSWALD. She recalled, however, that the young man she had seen in the B & B Restaurant had a small scar near his mouth, either on the right or left side.

Mrs. LAWRENCE advised she has no knowledge of the activities of JACK RUBY other than her acquaintance with him as a customer at the B & B Restaurant. She was not acquainted with LEE HARVEY OSWALD and had never seen him to her knowledge, unless he could have been the man who was with RUBY on the morning of November 22, 1963.

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In connection with the information furnished by MARY LAWRENCE on December 5, 1963, it should be noted that CURTIS LA VERNE-CRAFARD, when interviewed at Bellaire, Michigan, on November 28, 1963, advised that he was the individual who was with JACK RUBY at the B & B Cafe at approximately 3:45 AM on November 21, 1963. CRAFARD pointed out that when he met RUBY at the B & B Cafe, RUBY was accompanied by a girl named GLORIA.

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MALLES WILLIAM WESLEY UPPERMAN, stage name BILLY COLE, Room 5, Carlton Motel, Dallas, was interviewed in connection with information furnished by BOB PATTERSON, YMCA, Dallas, to the effect that on the evening of December 20, 1963, during a discussion at the Celebrity Bar, COLE said that he could prove STACKT RUBY had passed money to LEE HARVEY OSWALD. DEFERMAN related the following:

December 21, 1963

He was in the Celebrity Bar on the evening of revels December 20, 1963, where his wife, JO ANN UPPERMAN, is a barmaid and he had had a beer with BOB PATTERSON, who lives at the YMCA, Dallas. He said a discussion came up about RUBY shooting OSWALD and he said something to the effect that it was a shame RUBY had shot OSWALD. He said that nothing was said about RUBY giving OSWALD any money. COLE, who was born without legs and who is a singer by occupation, said that he at one time had worked for RUBY at both the Vegas and Carousel Clubs in Dallas and had related this to PATTERSON. COLE was introduced to RUBY in the fall of 1962 by police officer BILD SWAFFORD and went to work at the Vegas Club at that time as a singer. He was there for approximately six months and then went to the Carousel Club in downtown Dallas where he was employed for a couple of months. This latter employment ended in March or April, 1963. He has not worked for RUBY or seen him since except on one occasion in early November, he spoke to RUBY when both were at the Victor Lounge, Commerce Street, across from the Statler Hotel.

COLE is not acquainted with OSWALD and has never seen him any where and particularly he has not seen him in any of JACK RUBY's clubs in Dallas. He knows of no association or connection between OSWALD and RUBY; he had no idea why RUBY had shot OSWALD; he knew nothing of RUBY's movements between November 22 and 24, 1963.

COLE stated that he could always be reached c/o his mother, Mrs. MATTIE COLEMAN, who lives with her daughter, Mrs. FRANK BARRON, 509 Eden Place, Ventura, California,

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The following investigation was conducted by SAs ALLEN H. SMITH and TOM E. CHAPOTON, JR.:

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It will be noted that BOB PATTERSON, 511 YMCA, Dallas, Texas, is an admitted homosexual and has been interviewed previously and that he reported JACK RUBY and an individual he previously and that he reported once world and an individual believed to be LEE HARVEY OSWALD had appeared in PATTERSON's television-radio repair shop, which allegation was disproved. PATTERSON'S true name is ROBERT_KERMIT_PATTERSON.

It will also be noted that Patrolman BILL SWAFFORD, Dallas Police Department, has been interviewed previously.

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Mr. AlFRED B. HALL, 2420 19th Avenue, Port Buron, Michigan, Director of the Civil Department, St. Clair County Sheriff's Office, Port Huron, Michigan, stated that on either December 13 or 20, 1963, a Friday evening, at approximately 9 P. M., while at the 402 Club, 402 Quay Street, Port Huron, Michigan, his girl friend, Mrs. NORMA TRAVER, 920 Mansfield Street, Port Huron, and Miss PATTE LEVIS, a stripper, were sitting at the bar Mine AMARKA Street

In conversation, mention was made of President JOHN F. KENNEDY's assassination, and Miss LEWIS was heard to remark that she knew JACK RUBY as she had worked for RUBY at Dallas, Texas, presumably as a stripper, but did not otherwise state when she had been associated with RUBY.

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Mr. HALL stated that Miss LEWIS, who appeared at the time to be under partial influence of alcohol, advised in general terms which lacked complete understanding that the whole deal surrounding RUBY's connection with LEE HARVEY OSWALD's situation with regard to the President's death came out of Chicago. Miss LEWIS was then overheard to reportedly state, "I should keep my big mouth shut because every time I drink too much I start to talk too much."

Mr. HALL stated that when Miss LEWIS was asked why she knew of this situation as she had reportedly stated, she a commented she had travelled the circuit and had worked in the Chicago and made no further comment.

Mr. HALL stated that PATTI LEWIS is a white female, age 24, wears a blond wig, is 5'3" tall, 120 pounds, is three months pregnant and lives in St. Clair Shores, Michigan. She drives a new white Cadillac.

Mr. HALL stated that Miss LEWIS terminated her engagement at the 402 Club and her whereabouts are unknown although she reportedly remarked prior to leaving Port Huron that she was going to appear at the Brass Rail during the New Year's holiday.

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Port Huron, Michigan

Miss NORMA TRAVER, 920 Mansfield Street, Port Huron, Michigan, stated she recalled having been in the presence of Mr. ALFRED HALL and one PATTI LEWIS at the 402 Club, 402 Guay Street, Port Huron, Michigan, on a Friday evening in the middle of December, 1963, at which time she recalled Miss LEWIS making some remarks concerning the death of the late President, JOHN F. MENNEDY; but, inasmuch as she is hard of hearing and the comments which were made by Miss LEWIS were brief, she could not recall sufficient details of the comments to make further comment.

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On December 30, 1963, Detective HERMAN DUSELLIER, Port Huron, Michigan, Police Department, advised SA PHILIP L. MERCADO that the 402 Club, 402 Quay Street, Port Huron, as required, furnishes the names of all personnel employed at that club.

Detective DUSELLIER stated Port Huron records reveal that one DONELDA KAY BOYNTON, stage name PATTI LEWIS, 2527 Hartline, city not stated, was appearing as a stripteaser at the 402 Club the week of December 9, 1963. These records revealed Miss BOYNTON to be 24 years of age and to have a booking agent, namely, Delbridge and O'Halloran. DONELDA KAT BOINTON, 2527 Hartline, Rochester, Michigan (permanent address), was interviewed in her automobile in the parking lot of the Windsor Hotel, 2203 Cass, Detroit, Michigan, where she is temporarily residing. She advised that she is employed as an "exotic dancer" and had appeared at Charlie's 402 Show Bar, Port Huron, Michigan, for two weeks in the early part of December, 1963. She said she had appeared there under her professional name, PATTI LEWIS.

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BOINTON said that she does not know JACK RUBY, had never worked for him, or at his club in Dallas, Texas, and had not, in fact, ever worked in Texas. She further advised that she did not know LEE HARVEY OSWALD and knew of no connection between RUBY and OSWALD.

BOINTON said that she was acquainted with a stripper named "JADA" who had worked for RUBY and concerning whom there had been considerable publicity in the papers after RUBY killed OSWALD. She said she met "JADA" in about 1957 in Miami Beach, Florida, when they were both working there but she had not seen her since about 1958 or 1959 when they were working in Syracuse, New York. She said "JADA" owes her some money, possibly as much as \$300 or \$400 as a result of both funds and costumes she has given to her. She said that on several occasions after "JADA" had received publicity, she has mentioned that she knows RUBY.

BOINTON advised that she had no information which would indicate that the assassination of President KENNEDY and the murder of LEE HARVEY OSWALD were in any manner planned or controlled by any group, organization or individuals other than OSWALD and RUBY, respectively.

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BOINTON further advised that she has in the past worked in Chicago, Illinois, but the last time she was there was in 1956 and she knew of no one there who might be in any manner involved in either the assassination or the murder.

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Mrs. W. S. LUEBECK, 310 Worth Broadway, Havana, Illinois, mother-in-law to SA JAMES W. SWINFORD of the Dallas Division, telephonically advised SA SWINFORD on December 16, 1963, that Mrs. (FNU) ISAACS, Havana, Illinois, related to her that she had received a letter from her daughter, ALTA MARIA "SHIRLEY, who resides at 6814 Dalhart Lane, Dallas, Texas, wherein Mrs. SHIRLEY stated that her son, name unrecalled, had stopped at a gas station in the Dallas area and while at the station, the station attendant, name unknown, commented to him that he knew that LEE HARVEY OSWALD and JACK L. RUBY were acquainted as OSWALD used to drive RUBY's automobile to his gas station for servicing.

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Subsequent contact with Mrs. ALTA SHIRLEY and her son, JOHN, determined that JOHN SHARLEY, when home from Texas Tech College for Thanksgiving, heard of an SMU student who is a neighbor of CHARLES GOODBREAD, SHIRLEY's classmate, who had knowledge that OSWALD had often taken JACK RUBY's Cadillac car to a service station near the SMU campus, Dallas, for servicing.

Investigation identified the SMU student as WILLIAM VERNON UHLHORN.

Independent of the above, UHLHORN had been contacted on December 2, 1963.

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The following investigation was conducted by SAs WILLIAN C. BROOKHART and GEORGE T. BINNEY at Dallas, Texas:

On December 2, 1963, WILLIAN VERNON UHLHORN, student at Southern Methodist University, advised that he had heard a rumor that a colored employee of Mustang Service Station located on Hillcrest Avenue near Southern Methodist University, had remarked that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had driven JACK RUBY's Cadillac to the service station for servicing.

On December 2, 1963, LOWELL DES ENGLISH, Owner and manager, Mustang Service Center, 6511 Hillsrest Avenue, advised that his employee, ROBERT ROY, had made the comment that while in business for himself a few months ago at Ross Avenue Automotive, Dallas, Texas, IKE OSWALD had taken a 1959 Cadillac convertible to ROY to be repaired. ENGLISH stated he had discussed this matter at length with ROY and had enused in connection with the repairs of this alleged 1959 Cadillac. ENGLISH further advised that ROY had stated that in connection with the repairs of the Cadillac, he had driven OSWALD down town to JACK RUBY's burlesque house in Dallas. ENGLISH asked ROY how many times he several times. ENGLISH stated ROY had commented that the individual he knew as LEE was identified by ROY as being OSWALD through newspaper pictures after the assassination of President KENNEDY.

, ENGLISH stated that he had subsequently searched through the repair orders which ROY had in his possession with negative results. ROY advised ENGLISH that additional repair orders had been retained by the bookkeeper who had handled ROY's accounting matters in connection with the operation of the Ross Avenue Automotive repair.

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ENGLISH advised that records of his office revealed that ROBERT V. ROY was employed at the Mustang Service Station when ENGLISH took over the management of the service station on November 30, 1962. In March or April, 1963, ROY resigned to become self employed at the Ross Avenue Automotive DL 100-10461 DL 44-1639

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Service. ROY came back to work in October, 1963, at the Mustang Service Station.

On December 2, 1963, ROBERT VERNON ROY, mechanic, DA Mustang Service Station, residence 2318 Hatcher, advised that during the period he was self employed at the Ross Avenue Automotive Service located at 4228-30 Ross Avenue, Dallas, Texas, in late August or early September, 1963, he recalls that an individual known to him as Mr. LEE came to him for the purpose of doing repair work on a 1959 white Cadillac Convertible De Ville (62 Series). ROY stated that to the best of his recollection, LEE had stated on the first occasion of coming to him that he had been referred to ROY by a colored man who works at Cullum and Boren, a sporting goods company in Dallas, Texas.

ROY stated that he identified the person he knew to be Mr. LEE as LEE OSWALD through observing photographs of OSWALD in the Dallas newspapers following the assassination of President KENNEDY. A photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD was displayed to ROBERT VERNON ROY at this time, and he positively identified OSWALD as being the man for whom he did automotive repair work on a 1959 white Cadillac Convertible.

ROY stated that the repair work that he had performed for the person be knew as Mr. LEE would appear in his records. He made available two separate stacks of automotive repair orders to interviewing agents. A search of these records reflected no reference to a 1959 Cadillac.

ROY stated that additional repair orders were in the possession of an individual who had done accounting work for Ross Automotive repair. He identified this company as Whitehill Taxkedping System of Dallas, 13037 Glenside Drive, Dallas, Texas, home phone BL 4-2330.

ROY stated that he had performed services for Mr. LEE on approximately four separate occasions and on one occasion LEE was brought to the Ross Avenue Automotive Repair Service in 3 DL 100-10461 DL 44-1639

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a 1960 blue four door Chevrolet by three other men whom ROY could not describe. On two other occasions when Mr. LEE came to ROY with the Cadillac, ROY drove Mr. LEE to the downtown area of Dallas, letting Mr. LEE out of ROY's car near the intersection of Elm and Akard not far from Whittle's Music Store.

ROY denied ever observing Mr. LEE in any burlesque house in downtown Dallas, Texas, and further denied ever observing Mr. LEE in the company of JACK RUBY, whose photograph ROY had also observed in the Dallas newspapers following the killing of LEE HARVEY OSWALD. ROY denied having stated that he had driven Mr. LEE to a burlesque house in downtown Dallas and further denied any knowledge that the 1959 Cadillac Convertible upon which he had done repair work belonged to or was connected in any way with JACK RUBY.

On December 3, 1963, Mr. GORDON F. CULLUM, President, Cullum and Boren Company, 1509 Elm Street, Dallas, advised that his company employs approximately ten Negro men, and he would attempt to determine which one of these men may have taken a company car to the Ross Avenue Automotive Service for repairs.

On December 3, 1963, J. WALTER MALLOY, Cullum and Boren Company, advised that records of his office reveal a repair order from Ross Avenue Automotive bearing No. 1184 and dated June 8, 1963, in the name J. W. MALLOY on repair of a 1958 Chevrolet station wagon involving relining of brakes and replacement of two twin drums. This bill was paid by check No. 28331 on June 8, 1963, to Ross Avenue Automotive, 4228-30 Ross Avenue, in the amount of \$27.85.

Mr. MALLOY advised that the station wagon had been driven to Ross Avenue Automotive by employee JAMES EARL FUCUALS.

On December 3, 1963, JAMES EARL FUCUALS advised that he recalled driving the company station wagon to Ross

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Avenue Automotive sometime ago; however, he could not recall the date. He stated further that he could not recall ever having referred anyone to Ross Avenue Automotive. Photographs of LEE HARVEY OSWALD were displayed to FUCUALS, who stated that he had never seen LEE HARVEY OSWALD except in newspaper photographs following the assassination of President KENNEDY.

ROBERT VERNON ROY was reinterviewed at Mustang Service Station on December 3, 1963, at which time he made available additional automotive repair orders which he had located through a search of his automobile. A review of these automobile repair orders failed to reflect any record of repair for a 1959 Cadillac. ROY also conducted a search of his former place of business at 4228-30 Ross Avenue and his second automobile, making available additional auto repair work orders to interviewing agents. A review of these auto repair work orders failed to reflect repair on a 1959 Cadillac.

On December 3, 1963, OLIVER C. VAN HOESEN, 2201 West Irving Boulevard, Irving, Texas, furnished the following information:

A conditional sales contract executed by VAN HOESEN on July 23, 1963, in behalf of ROBERT ROY for Whitehill Taxkeeping System reflected that this bookkeeping system S went into effect September 1, 1963. Mr. VAN HOESEN advised that this account was serviced by a representative named HANK STILL, the salesman who had sold the plan to ROY. Mr. VAN HOESEN stated that he, VAN HOESEN, had retained no papers or repair orders of any type belonging to Ross Avenue Automotive Repair Service. He stated that these papers would have been in the possession of HANK STILL on a temporary basis; however, STILL had advised him that all such papers had been returned to Ross Avenue Automotive Repair Service. VAN HOESEN further advised that ROY's affairs were in a very turbulent condition and that he had gone out of business with his affairs and papers in complete disarray and confusion. He stated that subsequent efforts by VAN HOESEN to contact ROY relative to submission of his tax work' papers had been negative and that

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
