FUCUALS advised that he recalls now that a white man came into Cullum and Boren wanting to look at the yellow pages of the telephone directory indicating that he needed his brakes fixed and wanted to know where the nearest garage was. FUCUALS said that he could go to the Ross Avenue Automotive since he had taken a company car there and received satisfactory service. FUCUALS said that he believes the white man went to the garage on Ross Avenue, and at any rate he wrote the telephone number and address down.

This white man came into the Cullum and Boren store about two or three weeks after FUCUALS had taken the station wagon to the Ross Avenue Automotive Repair, and he described the white man as approximately 35-40 years of age, approximately 5.9%, heavy shoulders, wearing a sport coat or brown jacket and slacks. FUCUALS also believes this man was wearing suede loafer type shoes. FUCUALS did not observe the kind of automobile the man wanted repaired. FUCUALS again was shown a photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and said that this white man whom he referred to Ross Avenue Automotive did not in any way resemble OSWALD.

New Orleans on December 20, 1963, advised that JOHN LAURELL FORD was located on December 19, 1963, at 207 Louis Anne Avenue, Monroe, Louisiana. FORD stated he was employed at JERRY DUNCAN's service station in Dallas, Texas, from September, 1963, to November, 1963, and resided at 203 Elston Drive and 2423 Marfa Street, Dallas, during this period. FORD stated he placed a telephone call from the pay telephone located at Duncan Service Station to his mother's telephone, 323-6530, Monroe, Louisiana, sometime in the middle of October, 1963. FORD denied any contact or any knowledge of OSWALD and stated that the photograph of OSWALD does not remind him of anyone he has ever seen at the service station or in the neighborhood. FORD advised that the only person he drank beer with from the neighborhood of the station was a white male, 18-20 years of age, 5:3", 125-130 pounds, reddish blond hair, light complexion, dressed in cowboy boots and Western shirt, who rented a room from Mrs. A. C. JOHNSON across the street from the service station. FORD believes this person, name unknown, was employed at an auto parts store on Jefferson Street. FORD further advised this person does not resemble the photograph of OSWALD.

JERRY DUNCAN, operator, Enco Service Station, 1030
North Zangs Street, Dallas, advised SA HENRY J. OLIVER on
December 21, 1963, that he had previously advised that he
thought OSWALD had gone out on one occasion to drink beer
with JOHN L. FORD, a former employee of this station. DUNCAN
advised that the only information he can furnish regarding
this is that the person he thought might be OSWALD got in a
car with FORD and left with him one night after work. He
cannot place the exact date but it possibly was in October,
1963. He only saw this man in the car with FORD, and he was
some distance away from him at the time. He stated the person
with FORD to the best of his recollection did resemble OSWALD
and appeared to be similar in size. He advised he cannot
furnish any further information in this regard, and it is

Mrs. A. C. SOHNSON, 1026 North Beckley, Dallas, Texas, on December 21, 1963, advised SA CLIVER that she has a roomer at this address, a FLOYD DE GRAFFENRED, who wears cowboy clothing and who was formerly employed by some auto parts concern. She stated that DE GRAFFENRED is presently employed by Sears Roebuck and Company and has always appeared to be a person of good character.

Mr. FLOYD G. DE GRAFFENRED, 1026 North Beckley, employed Sears Roebuck and Company, Mail Order Division, Dallas, on December 21, 1963, advised that he is acquainted with JOHN FORD, who formerly was employed at the Euco Service Station at 1030 Zangs Street. He stated he on one occasion around October, 1963, was at the service station talking to JOHN FORD and they decided to go drink a beer after FORD got off from work. FORD needed a clean shirt, so he, DE GRAFFENRED, went to his room and got a clean shirt for FORD. After getting this shirt, he returned to the service station and got into a car which belonged to FORD or one of his relatives. FORD got off in a few minutes and they left together and had a few beers. DE GRAFFENRED advised he can never recall seeing LEE HARVEY OSWALD around the Enco Service Station, and to his knowledge, FORD is not acquainted with OSWALD. OSWALD did reside at 1026 North Beckley while DE GRAFFENRED resided at this same address. DE GRAFFENRED advised he does not believe he saw OSWALD more than four or five times and then mainly in the television room. OSWALD would not speak to anyone, and DE GRAFFENRED never at any time talked to him. DE GRAFFENRED stated he could not furnish the names of any friends or associates of OSWALD. He never saw OSWALD talk to anyone and never saw him have any visitors. DE GRAFFENRED stated he does not know JACK RUBY and does not know of any association between RUBY or OSWALD.

Mrs. L. A. DURDEN, 1916 Ida Street, Arlington, Texas, was interviewed at Bond's Clothing Store, A-Harris Shopping Center, Oak Cliff Section, Dallas, Texas, and furnished the following informations

She was born in Germany and came to the United States in 1950 after marrying an American serviceman. She said that she and her husband returned to Germany in 1958 and remained there until 1961, at which time they returned to the United States. She advised she is now divorced from her husband, that in August, 1962, she moved to her present address in Arlington and had a telephone installed in her home. Her telephone number is CR 4-2187.

Mrs. DURDEN stated that she receives very few telephone calls and to the best of her recollection, she did not receive a telephone call on October 25, 1963, and that she did not place a call to her residence on that date.

She could not think of anyone who could have called her from the public telephone booth located at the Enco Service Station, 1030 North Zangs Boulevard, and she has no recollection of ever having placed a call from this public telephone booth to her residence, or to any other individual.

Mrs. DURDEN stated that LEE HARVEY OSWALD and JACK L. RUBY were unknown to her prior to the assassination of President JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY, on Movember 22, 1963. She is not personally acquainted with these two individuals and the only information she has concerning them is what she has read in the newspapers and from television and radio.

DOUGLAS MOORE, 2537 West Eiest Boulevard, an engineer student at Southern Methodist University, Dallas, Texas, was laterviewed concerning information which he was said to have drawn from remarks by Professor ILYA A. AMAMANTOV in MAMANTOV's television appearance on December 10, 1963, at Dallas, Texas, that JACK RUBY and LEE HARVEY OSWALD had been associated with one another,

MOORE said he had drawn the conclusion RUBY and OSWALD were associated when Professor MANANTOV had reported that OSWALD had requested he be represented by Attorney JOHN ABT of New York City, New York. MOORE said he considered OSWALD's request for this particular attorney to be "some sort of code" between OSWALD and RUBY. This, he said, was the only basis for his having con-cluded there must be this relationship between RUBY and OSWALD, as drawn from remarks by Professor MAMANTOV. He added that he had not heard the telecast in question but had made his analysis from a report by his mother as to what MANANTOV had said.

- MOORE said it was evident to him, having followed reports closely in the manner of a detective, that RUBY shot OSWALD "to shut him up". - He expressed his suspicion of the results of any investigation which with refute reports that the two were associated in the assassination of President KENNEDY. He wondered, too, where OSWALD had gotten "all that money". found in his possession upon his arrest.

MOORE said his interest in following this case had prompted him to call the Dallas Police Department during the afternoon on the day after RUBY shot OSWALD, hopeful that he' could get some inside information. His call was switched to one whom he felt to be a young girl. In talking to her, he said he had deduced that some years in the past OSWALD had been employed by RUBY. He expressed uncertainty as to exactly what he had been told and could provide no information which might assist in identifying his source, a girl at the Dallas Police Department.

MOORE said that his father, a realtor, had expressed interest in part-time employment in undercover assignments for

JAMES 1 JACKSON, 2301 South Ervay, advised that he resides 5107 Junius and has no home telephone. He said he was employed at American Bakery Co., 2301 South Ervay, as a "mixer" and has been so employed since August, 1960. He states his Social Security No. is 465-54-6916, and noted that he formerly used Secial Security No. 465-50-6916, until he was advised by the Social Security Administrator that he should not use 50 as it was assigned to another person. This mixup occurred while he was in the Armed Forces or shortly after he got out, when he first went to work for American Bakery Co. He advised he has never known any person named LEE HARVEY OSWALD or JACK RUBY, also known as JACK RUBENSTEIN. He said he had heard of these names since the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY, and the murder of LEE RAEXEY OSWALD.

Mr. JACKSON said he first lived at 1204 McKee for about a year, then he moved to 214 West Neely, where he and his wife lived for about nine months, and thereafter moved to 701 North Boulevard Terrace until July, 1963; when he and his wife separated. Her name is SALLY ANN JACKSON, new Bryer. She now resides at 830 Sabine, Dallas, Texas. Mrs James D. Jackson

JACKSON states that his mother, Mrs. GUT ALEXANDER, resides 1825 Denton Drive in Carrollton, Texas, and she is the person listed on his employment record as the person to notify in case of death or accident. Mr. JACKSON said his immediate supervisor is Mr. OMAR CURTIS at the American Bakery Co., 2301 South Ervay.

JACKSON said he had no idea how LEE HARVEY OSWALD might have come in possession of a paycheck stub which apparently belonged to him, JACKSON, but that it was possible he might have accidentally dropped this checkstub on the street and someone could have picked it up, but he did not recall ever losing one.

He advised he came to work at his usual time, 10:00 A.M., November 22, 1963, and during the course of his morning employment had seen LEE HARVEY OSWALD, a fellow employee, filling orders on the first floor. He did not recall the specific time he saw OSWALD, stating it was shortly after he got to work and stated this was the only time he saw OSWALD on that particular day.

Approximately 12:30 P.M., he was standing inside the first floor of the Texas School Book Depository looking out the window at the crowd of people who had gathered to view the Presidential Motorcade. While looking out the window, he heard what he believed to be three shots and saw people running, and later determined the President had been shot. He did not view the Presidential Motorcade itself inasmuch as the crowd was in his line of sight, and did not see LEE HARVEY OSWALD after the shots were fired. He advised he never works beyond the fourth floor in the school book building and did not have an occasion on that date to go above the fourth floor, and, further, during his course of employment, he had never entered into any discussions of any kind with LEE HARVEY OSWALD. He advised he knew nothing about OSWALD and did not know JACK RUBY, and could offer no pertinent information of value.
