Dear Senator Tower:

There are many unanswered questions about the murder of President Kennedy and the murder of his murderer, and it appears that the Warren Commission is going to leave some of the most important of these questions unanswered.

For instance-in the files of the Dies Committee hearings of a few decades ago there appears the name of a Jack Rubenstein. He is listed as one of the founders of "Revolutionary Youth" a Marxist group in 1930, as one of the leaders of the Lovestone-Gitlow group of Communist Party U. S. A. in 1929, and reference is made to "Comrade" Jack Rubenstein a member of the National Executive Committee of the Young Communist League in a cable from the Young Communist International.

A complete investigation needs to be made to determine if the Jack Rubenstein who murdered Oswald and the Jack Rubenstein listed in the Dies Committee hearings records are one and the same. If they are found to be the same man it opens a whole new aspect in the murder of our President and the murder of his murderer.

Senator Tower, you know as well as I that the Warren Commission will try to "white wash" the whole affair unless they are forced by Congress to make the investigation complete.

I would be very interested and appreciative if you would use your influence to start an investigation of Jack Rubenstein alias "Jack Ruby."
