On Friday, 18 June 1954, Albert L. Patterson, Alabama Attorney General designate, was slain in Phenix City, Alabama.

Pattorson was investigating illegal gambling operations in the southeast Alabama town which fattened on soldiers from nearby Fort Benning, Georgia

Governor Gordon Persons immediately declared martial law in Phanix City, ordering the state National Guard to control the corrupt city government.

The grablers of Texas who were being investigated by Flatin A. Walker and Severnor Connally knew that to openly and obviously murder John B. Compally would spell the doom of their beoming enterprises, as had been the case in Flamin City a decade ago.

First they tried to kill Walker in order to seare Connelly, and failed. Then they tried to kill Connelly when he was with Kennedy and make it look like a mistake; the mistake happened in reverse.

Lee Csuald, was an occueinted with a Cleveland, Tennesses grabler, the lete(and unknownted) "Cae" Hooper. They had met in Chicago. My brother Major John S. Wyllie, who was stationed at Fort Hood, Texas in recent years, said while on leave last month that Oswald wer citer Contaily. Major Myllie helped guard President Manacdy in Central America in 1965.

Imfor Wyllie while stationed at Fort Hood probably learned of gambling operations behind fromto, like Raby's night club, the will-and-file soldiers and forwarded the information to officers like Major General Walter.
