ALSO OBTAIN ANY KNOWLEDGE HE MIGHT HAVE OF THE ASSASSINATION OF THE PRESIDENT, SHOOTING OF OSWALD OR ASSOCIATION BETWEEN RUBY AND OSWALD. HE MAY BE INTERVIEWED IN THE PRESENCE OF HIS ATTORNEY IF HE SHOULD MAKE THE SPECIFIC REQUEST.

BUFILES REFLECT THAT MILLER WAS INTERVIEWED BY THE DALLAS OFFICE IN THE CASE ENTITLED JAMES RIDDLE HOFFA, STOY DECKER, ET AL. Dallas advised that a long distance call was made from Ruby's Carousel Club 11-8-63 to Dusty Miller, Eden Roc Hotel, Miami, Florida. The Caller was not identified..... Barney Baker of Chicago, who was interviewed on 1-3-64, advised that Ruby had called him on 11-11-63 claiming to have contacted "mutual friends" who had told him that Baker was familiar with union matters which Ruby was trying to have straightened out. Timing of the call to Baker suggests possibility that Miller may have been a mutual friend. Interview of Miller was discussed with Kieffer and Kirtpatrick, Accounting and Fraud Section, who advised that there was no objection to interviewing Miller.
