interview Chadwell and to set out leads for collateral investigation by teletype to resolve the matter within three days. Denver is being instructed to interview Krutzner and submit results within three days. Mrs. Chadwell's letter to the Commission states that she heard news announcer Bob Walker mention the anticipated arrival of Ruby at the scene of the Oswald shooting prior to the shooting itself. The anonymous letter makes a similar allegation that a news report prior to the shooting mentioned Ruby's name in connection therewith. Krutzner's letter states that he has some information which he does not identify bearing on the assassination of President Kennedy. The anonymous letter is being searched through the anonymous letter file to see if the writer can be identified.
