Re: Shooting of Lee Harvey Oswald
Interview of B. S. Clardy

Sir:

B. S. Clardy was interviewed by Lieutenants C. C. Wallace and J. E. McHughren at 5:20 am on November 30, 1963. The interview was essentially the same as his original report dated November 27, 1963. The following was added by B. S. Clardy:

After the shot was fired, I went to the 5th floor with the prisoner. He was being questioned by several officers, and as I recall, the officers were Glenn Fin, Sgt. W. E. Bean, and Mr. Corral of the secret service. When asked why he did it, he replied, "somebody had to do it, I'll do it."

When asked how he got in, he said that he walked by the officer on the ramp when he turned to talk to his fiancee, who drove out the entrance. He said he heard somebody yell, "hey you." He didn't know where it came from, so he ducked his head and kept walking.

He also told us that he sent \$25.00 by wire to a girl in St. North.

He said also that it was a spur of the moment thing and it was a million to one chance that he got down there at the actual time Oswald was brought down.

I have been interviewed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. They talked to me Monday around 2:30. I gave them the usual information I have given here.
