Re: Interview of Reserve Officer, Entrolmon Merold E. Holly Jr., 325

On Lecomber 1, 1963 Reserve Officer, Introlmen Forold B. Holly Jr. was interviewed by the undersigned officers as to any information he might have concerning the shooting of Lee Harvey Oswald. Holly had not submitted a report prior to the interview with these officers.

Introlman Holly stated that he reported to the Hity Hall of approximately 11:30 a.m. on Hovember 25, 1963. He was assigned to work traffic at the intersection of Hain and Harwood Streets. At approximately 11:45 a.m. he was assigned to Tarkland Hospital to assist in the handling of traffic at that location.

Thile there, Holly stated that an unknown reserve police officer related to him that he, the unknown reserve officer, had passed deck histy into the basement of the City fell after huby had presented press credentials.

Holly was shown photographs of several reserva officers by Captain J. M. Solomon and was unable to identify this unknown reserve officer.

Captain Selemon aivised the undersigned officers to be sheptical of this information and not to place bee trush prefered in it.

Helly stated that he was not familiar with Jock Huby and had not usen him on the date of Cauald's shorting. At this time Wolly has not been dentioned by any favoral agency.
