Dear Mr. Rankin: Reference is made to your letter of January 1964, in which you advised that the Commission had Information that a Roland Spigale, an employee of the Southern Bell Telephone Company at New Orleans prior to December 33 had informed Shirley Lamprecht, his fiancee, that he had? learned the telephone records of his company showed Jack Ruby and Lee Harvey Oswald living at one time in the same apartment house in New Orleans. For your information, this Bureau has determined that Roland Spigale is apparently Roland Spedale, 903 Dante Street, New Orleans, an employee in the Customers Accounting Department of the New Orleans Public Service Company, Incorporated Spedale, according to Shirley Lamprecht, 1040 Farragut Street, E New Orleans, told her soon after the assassination of President Kennedy that the FBI had checked the records for gas and electric of service for Oswald's apartment in New Orleans with the New Orleans Public Service Company, Incorporated. Lamprecht stated that Spedale had not mentioned Jack Ruby. She and Spedale were later at a party in the home of Mrs. Vincent 2, Lococo, 3713 Dumaine Street, New Orleans, at which she told several individuals present the information given her previously by Spedale. Lamprecht advised that while the name of Buby entered the discussion as a result of interest in the newspaper stories about Oswald and Ruby, she made no statement to the effect that Ruby and Oswald lived in the same apartment house in New Orleans and she had no knowledge that such could be true! Bonorable J. Lee Rankin Spedale has advised this Bureau that he knew the FBI had checked on the electric and gas service for Oswald's apartment at 4905 Magazine Street shortly after Oswald's death. Spedale stated that he told Lamprecht he was impressed at the speed with which the FBI had checked the electric and gas records. Spedale also advised that he never had any information concerning Ruby and had made no statement to Lamprecht or anyone else that Oswald and Ruby had resided in the same apartment house.

Efforts are being made by this Bureau to locate and to interview Mrs. Vincent T. Lococo, and you will immediately be advised of the results of this interview.
