The information is similar to information furnished to Miami, 1/23/64, by JOSE ANTONIO LANUSA, Cuban Student Directorats, Miami, Fla. who advised the information was from a handbill circulated by the Anti-Communist Revolutionary Action Group, an Anti-Castro clandestine group in Cuba.

Although the information alleges that RUBY was in Havana about one year prior to Dec. 1963, there is no positive information which would establish RUBY's presence in Havana at that time.
