Memorandum from Rosen to Belmont dated January 24, 1964, set forth full details concerning a typographical error which had been discovered by SA C. Ray Hall of the Dallas Office while he was preparing to testify at Ruby's bond hearing on January 20, 1964. This error consisted of having set forth in one of the Dallas reports two interviews with subject Jack Ruby and the dates of the two interviews were reflected November 24, and 25, 1963, when in fact both interviews actually occurred on November 24, 1963. This error was corrected in sufficient time that there was no difficulty; however, it was pointed out the necessity of correcting the record both in the Department's and the President's Commission's files.

This matter was discussed with Mr. William Foley, in the absence of Assistant Attorney General Miller of the Criminal Division, and Mr. Foley advised there was no problem involved and the necessary corrections would be made.

Mr. J. Lee Rankin of the President's Commission was advised of the typographical error and stated that he certainly understood an error of this type occurring, but in view of the attitude of the Commission of having everything in writing, he would appreciate a letter advising the Commission of the facts concerning the correction.

ACTION:

There is attached a letter to Mr. Rankin setting forth the error that occurred along with the circumstances under which the error was discovered.
