The proparations which are being made in the trial of J. Ruby are indicative of a desire to put him to death.

I am going to tell you a few words:

- 1. President Kennedy was very much loved not only in the United States but throughout the world.
- 2. Hany, many of us are potential assassins of Oswald; search your conscience and you will see that you are one of them.
- 3. As far as we are concerned here, there are no doubts that Oswald was the assassin of Kennedy and Tippit. There is an overabundance of evidence and it is overwhelming. The fact that Oswald denied it does not change anything. The German fellow who killed the Lindbergh baby denied his crime up to the very last moment.
- 4. Remember that there never were any quarrels... 🗀 between Ruby and Oswald.
