SUBJECT: JACK L. RUBY
LEE HARVEY OSWALD - VICTIM
CIVIL RIGHTS

Since the shooting of Lee Harvey Oswald by Jack L. Ruby on 11/24/64, we have conducted a detailed comprehensive investigation of the shooting itself and an exhaustive investigation into the background and activities of Ruby. The results of this investigation which includes 3357 interviews set forth in more than 4163 pages of reports and memoranda have been furnished to the President's Commission.

Our investigation has not developed any positive information to indicate that Ruby had ever known or associated with Oswald prior to the assassination of President Kennedy or that Ruby conspired with anyone to kill Oswald. We have checked out literally hundreds of rumors and allegations to the contrary but in every instance they have proven to be unfounded.

We are currently conducting investigation on the basis of two requests from the President's Commission. One request received by letter dated 3/2/64 asked that we obtain copies of the Immigration and Naturalization Service records on Ruby's parents, Joseph and Fannie Rubenstein. It also asked that we obtain available records of toll calls made by Ruby, his three brothers and four sisters and twelve persons known to have been in contact with him between 9/26/63 and 11/22/63. This will be completed by 3/13/64. The second request received by letter dated 3/3/64 asked for copies of all records of interviews with Ruby or other persons who mentioned Ruby prior to 11/23/63 in all FBI files. Copies of this original source material is being submitted by the field by 3/17/64 and will be promptly furnished to the Commission.

We are closely following the state trial of Ruby now in progress in Dallas. The prosecution completed presentment of its case at 2:55 p.m., Friday, 3/6/64. The defense
