The President's Commission by letter dated March 30, 1964, has requested that we interview the companions of Marguerite Vea Riegler mentioned in her interview of November 25, 1963, (report of SA Clements dated November 30, 1963, page 673) with respect to the events described by Miss Riegler in that interview together with any other information that they may have concerning Lee Harvey Oswald and Jack Ruby and persons associated with them.

Immediately upon receipt, locate and interview the companions of Miss Riegler as requested by the Commission. Any additional logical inquiry indicated in the interviews which would shed light on this matter should also be conducted.

Submit results of interviews by airtel enclosing appropriate interview report forms (FD-302's) within five days of receipt of this communication in order that they may be appropriately disseminated to the President's Commission. The interview report forms should also be included in your next report.

NOTE: Miss Riegler, a student at SMU, Dallas, Texas, on 11/25/63 advised that she was at Phil's Delicatessen, Dallas, Texas, on the night of November 22, 1963, in the company of Rita Silverman, Bill Nichols, Dennis Martin, and Bob Sindelar, who are also students at SMU. She observed a man in the delicatessen whom she, on 11/25/63, identified as Ruby after having seen his photograph on television. Our investigation has established that Ruby was in Phil's Delicatessen on the night of 11/22/63 where he bought the sandwiches which he later furnished to the employees of the Dallas Radio Station.
