Enclosed for the Albuquerque Office is one copy of a rough draft letter prepared by Mrs. WILMA VAN DOREN, Gallup, New Mexico, regarding her interview with one FRANK BROWN, an employee of the Goodyear Service Store, 2000 East 66th Avenue, Gallup. 1/1/64

For the information of the Bureau and Dallas, EDDIE MOSES, El Paso, furnished the above mentioned rough draft letter to the El Paso County Sheriff's Office, stating that it contained the results of an interview by Mrs. VAN DOREN with FRANK BROWN. In the letter, Mrs. VAN DOREN attributes to BROWN the statement that an incident occurred in 1958, definitely linking the person believed to be identical with JACK RUBY to a gunrunning incident. These guns were reportedly being taken to Cuba and other
