They lived in the West section of Chicago, about the 3600 or 3700 block of Arthington, in an apartment. There were two boys and two girls in the family, and he knew the oldest boy, HI, the best. He was only vaguely acquainted with HI's younger brother, SPARKY, but remembers that SPARKY was a "go getter," always interested in ways to make money. He recalled that SPARKY once had several hotdog stands on Ogden Avenue in Chicago. At one time in the early sparky wanted him to print up some "V" for 1940's, SPARKY wanted him to print up some "V" for Victory stickers or plaques, but the venture intended by SPARKY never materialized, for some reason he was unable to recall. He knew SPARKY only vaguely, and has no recollection of his associates or activities. He does not recall SPARKY ever being in trouble of any kind, and SPARKY was single when he (SCHWARTZ) knew him. The RUBENSTEIN family was a very fine one in his opinion, and the children had a high regard for their mother. He did not know the father of the family, and assumed he was deceased. He lost contact with the family about 1948 when his work took him away from Chicago for long periods, and in 1951, he moved to California.

The following investigation was conducted on the basis of allegations of GEORGE WILLIAM PEHRENBACH, Medford, Oregon, in a signed statement dated Movember 25, 1963, previously reported. In substance, FEHRENDACH alleged his belief, on the basis of recent photographs of JACK L. RUBY, that RUBY is identical with one JACK RUBENSTEIN, who allegedly traveled from Chicago, Illinois to Muncie, Indiana, with an unnamed son-in-law of SAM JAFFE, jeweler and employer of FEHRENBACH, and attended meetings believed connected with the Communist Party at which certain named individuals were in attendance.

It is observed FEHRENBACH was born March 8, 1926, and 81leges he went to work for JAPFE at age 16, presumably in 1942. PEHRENBACH stated JAFFE, mow deceased, had two daughters, CHARLOTTE, and another, name unknown, who was married to the son-in-law of SAFFE in question. It is further noted FEHRENBACH alleged the individual believed by him to have been RUBY made two trips to Muncie during the period from "six months to a year" after he started to - work for JAFFE and FEHRENBACH's entrance into the United States Havy, June 14, 1944; and a third trip shortly after the birth of FEHRENBACH's first child in June, 1947.

In interviews on Hovember 24 and December 21, 1963, RUBY stated he first came to Dallas in June, 1947, returned to Chicago . for a short time and again returned to Dellas, all in 1947.

Previous investigation reflects RUBY, as JACK RUBEHSTEIN, resided in Chicago prior to induction into the United States Army Air Corps, on May 21, 1943, and entered on active duty May 28, 1943, ... at Camp Grant, Illinois. The following duty stations are reflected in his military service records

Investigation has established SAM JAFFE had three daughters, CHARLOTTE, married to SEYHOUR CHARIN, residence Chicago; MARION THE HO married to MATPRITZKER, who reportedly moved to Muncie, Indianat ... rzker in the late 1930's, operated a restaurant and after some five years returned to Chicago, and ROSYLYR, metried to IRVIN-BERKE - sta Dr b - 5-2-1 BERKESTEAD, who lived in Chicago during the pertinent period. In-

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stated he and his wife made occasional trips to Muncie to visit her parents, but were never accompanied by any JACK RUBENSTEIN.

Information concerning the identities of sons-in-law of SAN JAPPE as well as information concerning RUBY's military record were furnished to the Portland Office for use in reinterview of FEHRENBACH, results of which are set forth below.

On April 15, 1964, GEORGE WILLIAM FEHRENBACH, jeweler, Medical Center Building, Medford, Oregon, volunteered the following information and stated that he is willing to testify in a court of law to this information:

In 1942 when he was 16 years old, he left Muncie Central High School, Muncie, Indiana, and took a job with SAN JAPPE as a jeweler apprentice. The jewelry shop was located on Walnut Street between Jackson and Adams Street in Muncie, Indiana. He went to work for SAN JAPPE during the summer of 1942 and he never did return to high school.

FEHRENBACH said he believed he quit when he was in grade 10b. There was a group of men in the neighborhood who talked to him about the Communist Party and about Russia and he believed that they were members of the Communist Party. These men were PHILLIP JASSER, owner of Jasser's Clothing Store, Mulberry Street; LAWSON JAPPE, who owned Lawson's Jewelers on Walnut Street (nephew of SAM JAPPE); MORTON STANDT, who owned Standt's Jewelery Store on Jackson Street; HERB PAZOL and MORTOM PAZOL, who owned PAZOL's Jewelry Store. Herb Pazol

About six months to a year after he started to work for SAM JAPPE, a group of people came down from Chicago and he believed they were going to hold a meeting in Muncie. The group named above was going to attend the meeting and FEHRENBACH believed the meeting had something to do with the Communist Party or with Russia. The meeting was to be held in a union hall above SAM JAPPE's Jewelry Store.

In the group of people that came down from Chicago were SAM JAPPE's son-in-law and his wife, who brought with them a man who was introduced to FEHRENBACH as JACK RUBINSTEIN (phonetic).

FEHRENBACH stated he now recalls that SAM JAPPE's

daughter's name is CHARLOTTE/JAPPE and her husband's first

He stated he recalled SEYMOUR was tied up with show business in Chicago because he brought pictures of girls to the jewelry store and showed them to PEHRENBACH. Ly Lake wood 71. Highland Park, III.

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came to Muncie, Indiana, he had a very tall blond girl with him who was in show business. RUBINSTEIN was wearing a business suit and was well dressed. FEHRENBACH said he would describe him as follows:

PEHREMBACH stated the first time SEYMOUR, CHARLOTTE and JACK RUBINSED came to SAM JAPPE's Jewelry store was between the last two weeks of January, 1943, and March, 1943. The reason he stated this is he believes it was after Christmas of 1942, because business slowed down considerably.

The second time SEYMOUR, CHARLOTTE and JACK RUBINSTEIN TO BE visited Muncie, Indiana, was between March, 1943, and June, 1944, when he went into the service. He could not recall the exact time nor could he recall any details concerning this meeting. He said he could recall, however, that they were going to attend a meeting in the hall above SAM JAFPE's jewelry store and that JACK RUBINSTEIN showed him a few card tricks. tricks.

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PEHRENBACH said he could not recall whether
RUBINSTEIN brought the tall blond girl with him at the
second meeting.

PEHRENBACH went in the Navy on June 14, 1944, and was discharged on June 21, 1946. He then went back to his job with SAM JAPFE at the jewelry store. والمحارض ويستج ويبيني

Shortly before or after his first boy was born in June, 1947, there was another meeting and JACK RUBINSTEIN came again from Chicago, Illinois, with SEYMOUR (last name unknown) and CHARLOTTE JAFFE (last name unknown). This meeting was held in the union hall above the JAFFE store. He could recall that prior to the meeting in the evening these three individuals were talking with SAM JAPPE in his office concerning a map of World War II on which SAM JAPPE kept track of how Russia was advancing into Germany and how the American Forces were advancing also. He could recall there was discussion about the proper indication of Russian and American advances into Germany by the group, and he heard them state that SAM JAFFE did not have the advances far enough into Germany by the Russian forces. The next morning after the meeting he was sent up to the union hall to get a chair that had been taken up there from the level by store chair that had been taken up there from the jewelry store. Up in the hall he saw a list of names on a table. There were two to four typewritten pages of names and he said he were two to four typewritten pages of manual and other could recall the first name being LAWSON JAPPE and other pages, HERBERT PAZOL. names on the page as being PHILLIP JASSER, HERBERT PAZOL, MORTON PAZOL, MORTON STANDT, (first name unknown), last name SHUSTER, and JACK RUBINSTEIN. He took these pages containing the list of names to MERVIN COLLINS, an uncle of his wife, who was on the Muncie Police Department, and he stated he would turn the names over to the FBI.

PERRENBACH said as he recalled, PHILLIP JASSER, LAWSON JAPPE, HERBERT PAZOL, and MORTON PAZOL had asked him whether he saw any papers on the desk at the union hall and he told them no. He could recall that either PHILLIP
JASSER or one of the PAZOL brothers told him if he had
papers he should give them back because he could get into JASSER or one of the PAZOL brothers told him if he had trouble.

He said he could recall this third meeting because they made remarks of his being in the U.S. Navy.

PD 44-225 He said he also recalled that PHILLIP JASSER was the one who kept telling him to get on the right side of the fence.

PHILLIP JASSER and LAWSON JAPPE also told him about communism being the only law to live by and that it is the greatest movement in the world. They also told him that eventually communism would be a second to the second that eventually communism would be a second to the second that eventually communism would be all over the world, including the United States of America.

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He stated he could not recall whether they said JACK RUBINSTEIN was in the armed services but it seemed to him they said he was. However, he is not sure. He to him they said he was. However, he is not sure. He said he did know that JACK RUBINSTEIN never had a military uniform on when visiting Muncie, Indiana.

He believed they made the trip from Chicago, Illinois, to Muncie, Indiana, by car and that it was a new car. He recalled SEYMOUR, CHARLOTTE and JACK RUBINSTEIN trying to figure up their gas mileage from Chicago to Muncie to get an idea how many miles per gallon they got on the new car.

SAM JAPPE's other daughter, MARION, was married to MAX PRITZKER and they had a restaurant in Muncie, Indiana. He recalled that MARION and MAX did not associate with the

He stated he is not acquainted with SAM JAPPE'S daughter, ROSLYN or her husband, IRWIN BERKE. He only knew CHARLOTTE and MARION JAPPE.

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The only individuals whom he can recall travelling from Chicago, Illinois, to Muncie, Indiana, for the three meetings were SEYMOUR, CHARLOTTE, JACK RUBINSTEIN, and the tall blond-haired girl. He believed on the third meeting the tall girl did not accompany them.

He stated to the best of his recollection that the first meeting was approximately in January - March, 1943; the second meeting from March, 1943, to June, 1944, before he went into the U.S. Navy, and the third meeting shortly before or after his first son was born on June 2, 1947.

He still believes that the picture of JACK RUBY in the Oregon Journal, Movember 25, 1963, is a very good likeness of the person who was introduced to him as JACK RUBINSTEIM.

He appears older and the hairline is a little higher.

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A review of the Indianapolis files reflect MERVYN COLLINS had been Chief of Detectives for the Muncie Police Department, Muncie, Indiana and is now deceased.

The Indianapolis Office files contain no record of any list received from COLLINS.

Indiana, advised as follows:

He operated a bingo game at Jaffe's Jewelry Store . at 2152 South Walnut Street, Muncie, Indiana, in 1948 and until January, 1949. He believes Ross Furriers located on first floor of this address and Jaffe's Jewlery Store on second floor. He operated his bingo game on the third floor just above Jaffe's Jevelry Store.

In 1947 and as far back as 1942, the Disabled American Veterans Organization and the Local Ironworkers Union had meeting places on the third floor to the rear of his bingo game, at this address. He stated considerable gambling activity by cards and slot machines was conducted by the Disabled American Veterans and the above union. He was closely associated with this gambling. activity during this period of time. He does not know of any other types of meetings including Communist Party meetings being held at this address or any other address. He has seen the photograph of JACK RUBY or JACK RUBENSTEIN and has never known this person. He knows of no children of SAN JAFFE.

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HERBERT PAZOL was interviewed at Pazol's Jevelers MERBERT PAZOL WAS Interviewed at Pazol's Jewelers, and was exhibited photographs of JACK RUBY which appeared in "Muncie Star" newspaper, issue of Movember 25, 1963, and he stated RUBY and/or RUBENSTEIN unknown to him. He admitted knowing GEORGE WILLIAM PEHRENBACE/ stating the latter had worked for SAM JAPPE many years ago. He stated SAN JAPPE died about four years ago while he was residing in Florida. He denied any knowledge of or attendance of Communist Party meetings at Muncie, Indiana, in 1942 or 1947-1948, of any individual identifiable with JACK BUBY. He does not know the names of the sons-in-law of SAN JAFFE, but stated LAWSON JAFFE, mephew of SAN JAFFE, who is presently in levelry business in Dayton, Ohio, should know the identify of sonsin-law.

HERBERT PAZOL advised no Communist Party meetings were ever held in Muncie at SAN JAPPE's Jevelry Store to his knowledge. He also stated no Union Hall was located above this store, but that in early and middle 1940s, a gambling joint was located there. He advised he does not recall ever going to this gambling joint and he does not recall SAM JAFFE's sons-in-law ever coming to Muncie, Indiana, from Chicago, Illinois, but believed they lived in Muncie until at least the late 1940s, but he cannot be sure of this.

He advised he did not recall RUBEN RESNIKOFF, also known as RUBY COOPER, a "Daily Worker" correspondent of Chicago, Illinois, who visited Indiana on numerous occasions during the 1940s and as late as 1948.

MORTON PAZOL was interviewed at Muncie, Indiana,

and advised as follows:

PAZOL admitted joining the Communist Party (CP)

in Indianapolis, Indiana, sometime during the year of 1940. He was unable to recall the exact date. He advised he voluntarily went to Indianapolis and looked up an Indianapolis attorney, whose name he was not able to recall, advising him he desired to become a member of the CP. PAZOL further advised he withdrew from the CP sometime during the year of 1947. He was unable to recall the exact, date of his dropping membership with the CP. He stated the reason he dropped out of the CP was because he no longer was in sympathy with their ideas. He advised the only reason he joined the CP in the first place was because he considered their activities the same as a Labor Union and he was active and interested in labor activities in Muncie, Indiana. He admitted he was a subscriber to "The Worker", but stated he never subscribed to the "Daily Worker".

PAZOL has stated several meetings were held by him in Muncie, Indiana, during his membership in the CP and that these meetings were held in his home. He stated he did not consider " them CP meetings but study groups who were studying the Communist philosophy and doctrines. He further advised the idea of control of this country by Russia was never discussed at any meetings held in his home or any of the CP meetings he attended in Indianapolis. He advised if his wife had been a member of the CP, it was only because of the fact she was married to him and she did not possess any sympathies for the CP.
