Reference is made to my letter dated July 16, 1964, wherein you were advised that a review of the records of the Court of Criminal Appeals, Austin, Texas, in the case of Paul Rowland Jones versus The State of Texas was being conducted to determine whether or not the name of Jack L. Ruby is mentioned anywhere in these records.

Enclosed herewith are two copies of a memorandum dated July 29, 1964, at San Antonio, Texas, setting forth the results of the review of these records.

Investigation is continuing to locate for review the documents which had been released on December 2, 1950, to George Butler, representing Carl F. Hansson, former Chief of Police, Dallas, Texas.

NOTE: Former Dallas County Sheriff Steve Guthrie advised Ruby appeared prominently in investigation of criminal conditions, Dallas, Texas, in 1946 to 1948. Lieutenant Butler, Dallas PD, worked on same investigation and Ruby's one connection was that upon completion of investigation and Jones' conviction, Jones and his associates began to hang out at Ruby's night club. Jones when interviewed said Ruby not connected with his criminal activities. Commission has requested we determine if phonograph recordings in connection with the 1946-1948 crime investigation are in existence and if so it be reviewed to determine whether or not name of Jack L. Ruby was mentioned anywhere therein.
