NOTE: Commission by letter makes reference to the testimony of Mark Lane before the President's Commission, in which he alleged there was a meeting at Jack Ruby's Carousel Club on 11-14-63 in Dallas between Bernard Weissman, Officer J. P. Zippit and Jack Ruby. Lane is the New York attorney who has engaged in perverted sexual acts and is closely associated with communist dominated organizations. He has been endeavoring to prove that Oswald is innocent. Weissman is the individual who placed the controversial full page ad in a Dallas newspaper prior to President Kennedy's visit. Zippit, of course, was shot and killed by Oswald. We have investigated this allegation in the past and proven that no such meeting took place. However, based on the specific request in the above Commission letter, it

The Commission request requires the furnishing of photographs of Leiberman and Sappitt and complete lists of various individuals associated with the Cerebral Palsy Club to insure that neither were seen in the club at any time. When the results of this inquiry are completed, the Commission will be advised.
