NOTE: Commission by letter makes reference to the testimony of Mark Lane before the President's Commission, in which he alleged there was a meeting at Jack Ruby's Carousel Club on 11-14-63 in Dallas between Bernard Weissman, Officer J. B. Tippit and Jack Ruby. Lane is the New York attorney who has engaged in perverted sexual acts and is closely associated with communist dominated organizations. He has been endeavoring to prove that Oswald is innocent. Weissman is the individual who placed the controversial full page ad in a Dallas newspaper prior to President Kennedy's visit. Tippit, of course, was shot and killed by Oswald. We have investigated this allegation in the past and proven that no such meeting took place. However, based on the specific request in the above Commission letter, it

appears the Commission is endeavoring to check out every possible facet of this matter to preclude possible criticism in the future.

The Commission request requires the submission of photographs of DeLozier and Goggin and copies of names of various individuals associated with the Carroll Club to insure that neither were seen in the club at any time. When the results of this inquiry are completed, the Commission will be advised.
