NOTE:

By letter dated 8/11/64 the Commission requested reinterview of Robert L. Norton who is the owner of Pago Club, Dallas, Texas, which was visited by Ruby on the night of 11/23/63 as established by previous investigation. Wanda Helmick was a waitress at the drive-in operated by Ralph Paul, a close associate of Rubys. She reportedly wrote a letter to her sister-in-law Rosemary Helmick wherein she thought she had mentioned Ralph Paul's end of a telephonic conversation with Ruby which she had overheard on the night of 11/23/63. Rosemary Helmick did not recall receiving such a letter from Wanda but furnished a letter wherein Wanda made mention of Ruby's trial.
