As a result of the depositions of Harry Olsen and his wife, former dancer, Kathy Kay Coleman, it appears that a man ramed 'Johnnie" (LHU), who was employed in Hovember 1963 at a parking rorage near the corner of Jackson and Fields Streets in Dallas, was also a witness to the hour-long conversation which Ruby had on Saturday morning, November 23 with Olsen and Kathy Kay.

The Commission would appreciate your attempting to locate "Johnnie" and interviewing him in connection with Buby's conversation. In particular, please ascertain whether or not the Olsens stated that Oswald should be lynched, drogged through the streets, or otherwise punished without due process of law. Please also inquire as to any other states sets that he may have heard made by Ruby or the Olsens.
