NOTE:

George Senator was a close friend and the roommate of Rubys at the time of the assassination and Ruby's interview of Oswald. The Commission indicates that Ruby in his interview on June 7, 1964, indicated that he made up his mind to shoot Oswald at 9:15 that morning. Senator was at the apartment when Ruby left to go to the Western Union Office and one William Downey has reported that Senator called him to come over to his house for breakfast shortly before the shooting. The Commission desires reinterview of Senator to determine if Ruby expressed any indication that he was going to shoot Oswald prior to leaving the apartment and to determine why Senator did not eat breakfast with Ruby that morning.
