

Reference is made to your letter of July 30, 1964, requesting an investigation to determine how "The Dallas Times Herald" learned of questions and answers which were published in numerous newspapers on the polygraph examination of Jack Ruby on July 15, 1964.

The results of this Bureau's investigation were furnished to you by my letter of August 19, 1964, with the exception of an interview with Miss Odell Oliver, the court reporter who recorded the interview. Enclosed herewith are two copies of a memorandum dated August 24, 1964, at Dallas, Towns, setting forth an interview with Miss Odell Oliver.

This concludes the investigation requested in your letter of July 20, 1964.



MOTE: At the request of the Fresident's Commission, Ruby was afforded a polygraph examination at the Dallas County Jail on 7/18/64 by SAs Herndon and Wood. The questions used in the examination were prepared by the Commission and all arrangements as to who would be present were made by the President's Commission. On 7/22/64 "The Dallas Times Herald" printed an article which set from the polygraph examination and the President's Commission by letter 7/30/64 requested investigation to determine how "The Dallas Times Herald" learned of the questions and answers which were published. With this interview of Oliver we have completed interview of all persons present during the interview with the exception of the President's Commission's representatives, and all denied releasing the information. Officials of "The Dallas Times Herald" declined to reveal their source of information.
