NOTE: The President's Commission by letter 7/30/64 advised that Ray Pryor, a composing room employee of The Dallas Times Herald in testifying before the Commission stated that he saw Jack Ruby about 4:00 P.M., Saturday, 11/23/63 and that a fellow employee by the name of Griffin was present during part of his conversation with Ruby. It was requested that we identify and interview Griffin. Dallas determined that Griffin's correct name was Kenneth E. Griffith who stated that he was present for a few minutes during Pryor's conversation with Ruby, at which
