Ruby has stated that he had a conversation on the early morning of 11/23/63 with Harry Olsen, who was then a Dallas Police Officer, and Kathy Kay Coleman, a former stripper at Huby's Carousel Club. We have interviewed Olsen and Coleman and conducted extensive investigation to verify this meeting. Commission states that as a result of dispositions taken from Olsen and Coleman it appears that an unidentified "Johnnie" was a witness to the conversation.
