Harry Olsen is an ex-Dallas police officer who, sin the assassination, married Kathy Kay Coleman, one of Ruby's' ex-strippers. Ruby, when interviewed by the Commission on E6/7/64, stated that be met the Olsen's on the street on the early morning of 11/23/63 and had a discussion about the assassination with them. We have interviewed both of the Olsen and they have testified before the Commission. The Commission requested that we obtain all existing toll records relating to the Olsen s, both in Dallas and at their present residence in California. The telephone companies are usually required to maintain such records for a period of six months. The enclosed memoranda of August 11 and 13, 1964, when initially submitted were not complete in that they did not identify subscribers and it was necessary to send out for corrected and amended pages which arrived at the Eureau 9/3/64.
