The President's Commission on the Assassination of President KENNEDY has heretofore been furnished copies of photographs of certain property of JACK L. RUBY found in the possession of the Dallas, Texas, Police Department and Dallas County District Attorney. The Commission has noted that at the time of his arrest, the back seat of RUBY's car contained partial copies of the "Dallas Morning News" and "Fort Worth Star Telegram" newspapers, issues for November 20, 1963; a partial copy of the "Wall Street Journal", issue of November 18, 1963; an advertisement for "HLH Products"; and several "Life Line" radio transcripts. It is observed that photographs of RUBY property made on June 1 and 2, 1964, above, do not appear to include these items.

The Commission requested investigation to locate and forward, if possible, accurate copies of these papers as they were found in RUBY's car, and advice if all property found in RUBY's car has been located and photographed.

Files of the Dallas FBI Office concerned with this investigation disclose property of RUBY known to have been in the possession of Dallas Police Department was reported to have come from three sources; namely, RUBY's person, his automobile, and his apartment.

Special Agents of the FBI inventoried certain of the RUBY property in possession of Dallas Police Department as follows:

A. Items said to have been removed from RUBY's person at Dallas City Jail, inventoried November 24, 1963.

B. Items said to have been removed from RUBY's car by Dallas Police Department, inventoried November 24, 1963.

C. Items observed by Special Agents in RU37's car at Dallas Police Auto Pound, inventoried November 25, 1963.

D. Items observed by Special Agents in RUBY's car at Dallas Police Auto Pound, inventoried November 28, 1963.

E. Items said to have been removed from RUBY's apartment under search warrant, inventoried November 24, 1963.

By communication September 11, 1964, the Bureau was advised that comparison of items said to have been removed from RUBY's person, A above, were found to be substantially identical with items found at the Property Room, Dallas Police Department, on June 2, 1964. The Bureau was informed that examination of items said to have been removed from RUBY's car by Dallas Police Department, B above, were found to be substantially identical with items observed by Special Agents and photographed at the Dallas Police Department, December 3, 1963, and again observed and photographed in the office of the Dallas County District Attorney on June 1, 1964. It is observed the items specifically mentioned by the Commission were listed among items observed in RUBY's car at the Dallas Police Auto Pound on November 28, 1963, D above. The Bureau 'as informed of negative results to locate any additional RUBY property in possession of the Dallas Police Department and/or the Dallas County District Attorney.

There follow the results of investigation elsewhere.

EVA GRANT, 3929 Rawlins Street, telephone LA 6-6258, advised she did not go to the apartment previously occupied by JACK L. RUBY on November 24, 1963, but did go a few days later. She obtained some of his clothing and other personal effects.

She said GEORGE SENATOR's property had already been removed for the most part. She is of the opinion SENATOR may have taken some of RUBY's clothing, specifically mentioning RUBY had several hats and suits which she did not find when she went to the apartment. She said she was told by JIM MARTIN, Dallas attorney and friend of SENATOR, that SENATOR had brought a substantial amount of clothing to MARTIN's apartment and wanted \$200 or \$300 for the clothing. She said MARTIN had told her she could come to his apartment and look at the clothing but she had not done so as she considers MARTIN a "wolf" and her brother, SAMUEL RUBY, had declined to go with her. She said a diamond engagement ring which was originally the property of SAM RUBY, but which JACK used in connection with his former engagement to ALICE NICHOLS, is missing.

Mrs. GRANT was asked if she had retrieved any of the property taken by Dallas Police Department from RUBY's person, automobile, or apartment. She said she had not, although she had asked the police for such property. She said she does not know where the property can now be located.

Mrs. GRANT was asked if she has in her possession any papers of RUBY of any nature. She produced two cardboard boxes of assorted papers, stating she does not know where they came from, whether from the Carousel Club, Vegas Club, or RUBY's apartment. She said these papers would be made available for examination and photographing if desired by Agents.

She hastily thumbed through the papers and took out a letter addressed to her which she said was purely personal. She also took from the papers and retained a stub showing RUBY had purchased a \$50 Cashier's Check No. 16750 from Bank of Services and Trusts, Dallas, payable to "Sam Bloom Trustee." She said she does not know what the check was for but was convinced it was for some sort of charity. She noted that SAM BLOOM is a Dallas advertising and public relations man

The contents of one box appear to be primarily concerned with operation of Vegas Club. Numerous invoices for merchandise and services were noted, along with bank statements, records of payments for payroll, etc.

Papers in the second box appear to concern the Carousel Club and its predecessor, Sovereign Club. Among the papers are records of receipts and payments, papers concerning taxes, and applications for membership in Sovereign Club.

The various papers were photographed under SA CLEMENTS' supervision.

SAMUEL DAVID RUBY, 11616 Jamestown, brother of JACK L. RUBY, advised he had made arrangements in late 1963 to purchase a 1960 Oldsmobile previously repossessed by Merchants State Bank, same having formerly been the property of JACK RUBY. He said he did not recall the exact date of his purchase, but noted his first payment was made on February 28, 1964. He said the bank had maintained the car on a parking lot on Ross Avenue, Dallas, prior to his taking possession.

Mr. RUBY stated he removed numerous items from the automobile on assuming possession of the car. He said he specifically recalled a partial issue of the November 20, 1963, issues of the "Fort Worth Star Telegram" and "Dallas Morning News". He said he also recalled observing a copy of the "Wall Street Journal"; an advertisement of "HLH Products"; and several "Life Line" radio transcripts. He said these papers were kept in his home for some weeks following which he discovered that a maid, seeking to assist Mrs. RUBY, had thrown these items, and perhaps other papers removed from the car, away to be collected as garbage.

Mr. RUBY, with the assistance of his wife, produced such articles as he had removed from the automobile and permitted same to be photographed. When it was pointed cut to Mr. RUBY that certain of the items photographed were not identifiable as RUBY property observed in the automobile by Special Agents on November 25 and 28, 1963, Mr. RUBY stated he had obtained some items, specific identities not recalled, at the Carousel Club during the period it was being operated by RALPH PAUL following JACK RUB7's arrest.

As to certain papers observed by Special Agents in RUBI's car on November 25 and 28, 1963, but not located by Mr. RUBY on this date for photographing, he stated he can only assume the items were not in the car when he came into possession of same or else had been thrown away by the maid previously mentioned. He specifically stated no clothing of JACK RUBY was found in the car by him, and speculated same and possibly other articles may have been removed by personnel of Dallas Police Auto Pound or employees of the parking lot on which the automobile had been stored following repossession. He noted, however, that certain other items of value, for example, a radio and adding machine, were in the car.

Presto 1 WILLIE MILLS DICKEY, 4807 Skillman, advised he was employed as a property clerk for the Dallas Police Department, Dallas, Texas, on November 25, 1963, in the property bureau of the Dallas Police Department, Dallas, Texas. Mr. DICKEY stated he was a retired captain in the regular United States Navy. Mr. DICKEY observed Dallas Police Department Property Clerk's Invoice No. 11105G which was an invoice reflecting property received by Mr. DICKEY and B. J. SMITH, a property clerk, on November 25, 1963. Mr. DICKEY related that this property was property received from Lieutenant RICHARD SWAIN and Lieutenant VERNON SMART of the Dallas Police Department. Mr. DICKEY advised that he checked this property and filled out Invoice No. 11105G and placed it in the property room of the Dallas Police Department. Mr. DICKEY affixed his initials on a copy of this invoice. This property was received from Lieutenant SWAIN and Lieutenant SMART, according to Mr. DICKEY, and tagged with the date of November 24, 1963.

Mr. DICKEY viewed a photostat of Dallas Police Department Property Invoice No. 11107G which contained a listing of property taken from JACK RUBY on November 24, 1963. Mr. DICKEY stated this property was taken from JACK RUBY by Lieutenant VERNON SMART and Lieutenant RICHARD SWAIN on November 24, 1963, tagged, and brought to the property room of the Dallas Police Department on November 25, 1963, where this invoice was made up by him and property clerk B. J. SMITH, and, thereafter, this property was placed in the files of the property department of the Dallas Police Department on November 25, 1963. Mr. DICKEY initialed this photostat reflecting receipt of property contained on Dallas Police Department Invoice No. 11107G.

Mr. DICKEY observed Dallas Police Department Invoice No. 11109G which contained the property of JACK RUBY. This invoice reflected that this property had been received from the jail on November 25, 1963. Mr. DICKEY stated that it was the policy of the Dallas Police Department that when property was removed from prisoners it was to be tagged and placed inside a vault similar to a night safety depository of a bank. Mr. DICKEY placed his initials on the photostat of Dallas Police Department Invoice No. 11109G reflecting that the property contained on this invoice was received by him on November 25, 1963, and thereafter placed in the vault in the property moom of the Dallas Police Department.

Mr. DICKEY stated that he was not aware of any property not listed in these invoices that was taken from RUBY at the time of his arrest and, as far as he knew, all such property normally would be listed in a property invoice. He stated that Mr. SMITH's full name was BILLIE JOE SMITH and that his headquarters was in the Ingram Building, 2848 Veterans Highway, New Orleans, Louisiana.


