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

H. BAREFOOT SANDERS, United States Attorney, Northern District of Texas, advised that on the morning of June 12, 1964, HELEN IAIDRICH, court reporter, delivered to him, at his office, the original and a copy of the transcript of the deposition of JACK L. RUBY to the President's Commission on the Assassination of President KENNEDY. He said he, on the afternoon of the same date, dictated a letter to Mr. ARLEN SPECTER, 1510 Philadelphia Savings Fund Building, 12 South 12th Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, by which he transmitted the original of the transcript. The secretary, to whom he dictated, sealed the envelope addressed to Mr. SPECTER in his, SANDERS', presence and, thereafter, sent it by registered mail, return receipt requested.

Mr. SANDERS said his copy of his letter to Mr. SPECTER does not show the initials of the secretary to whom he dictated. He said his first impression was he dictated to THELMA ABLES of his staff, but has been told by Mrs. IVOJEANE ALEXANDER, also of his staff, that it was she to whom he dictated. He stated he advised Mr. SPECTER, in his letter, that a copy of the transcript was being retained in his office pending any instructions as to other disposition. He said copies of numerous transcripts of depositions of various persons interviewed by the Commission had been retained in his office for possible future reference. He said he placed the copy in this instance at the rear of the center drawer of his desk where it remained several weeks. He said his desk is normally locked when he is not at the desk and, in any event, he has no knowledge that any employee of his office or other person was aware of its location in his desk. He said employees of his office do not enter his desk except on instructions to do so.

Mr. SANDERS, continuing, stated in recent weeks he had the copy of the RUBY transcript removed from his desk and placed in a safe in the office of Assistant United States Attorney MARTHA JOE STROUD with other documents concerned with the Commission. He said to the best of his knowledge only the secretary to whom he dictated, Miss STROUD, and he knew of the existence of the document in his office.

Mr. SANDERS stated he has no recollection that court reporter HELEN LAIDRICH furnished to him her notes from which the transcript was made. In some instances court reporters working for the Commission have furnished their notes along with various transcripts.

Mr. SANDERS stated he had no information as to how DOROTHY KILGALLEN came into possession of the transcript of RUBY's deposition. He said he had, at the request of the Commission, obtained the services of several court reporters, including HELEN LAIDRICH, to take notes in connection with various depositions. He said HELEN LAIDRICH has a good reputation. He noted that it has been reported in the press that LAIDRICH was a one-time employee of MELVIN BELLI, former RUBY defense counsel, in San Francisco. He said LAIDRICH had informed him of this previous employment some fifteen years ago, that the employment had been brief and that she had not seen Mr. BELLI in recent years. He said this information was made known to Commission representatives prior to her use.

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IVOJEANE ALEXANDER, secretary, office of the United States Attorney, H. BAREFOOT SANDERS, Northern District of Texas, advised that on an unrecalled date some two months ago, she was given dictation by Mr. SANDERS of a letter directed to Mr. ARLEN SPECTER of the President's Commission on the Assassination of President KENNEDY. Mr. SANDERS handed her a sealed envelope purported to contain the original of a transcript of the deposition of JACK L. RUBY. This envelope was sent as an enclosure to the letter to Mr. SPECTER. She typed the letter to Mr. SPECTER and after Mr. SANDERS had signed same, she took the envelope to the United States Post Office and arranged for its transmission by registered mail.

Mrs. ALEXANDER said she was aware there was a copy of the transcript which was retained by Mr. SANDERS, inasmuch as the letter to Mr. SPECTER stated a copy was being retained. She said she did not see the original, as it was in a sealed envelope and did not see the copy then or at any other time. She said she was not aware as to how Mr. SANDERS came into possession of the transcription.

Mrs. ALEXANDER stated she has no information as to who furnished a copy of the document to DOROTHY KILGALLEN.

When she asked as to the purpose of interview and was informed, she advised personal interview was inconvenient but she would talk by telephone.

Miss ABLES stated she recalls on numerous occasions various court reporters have brought transcripts of depositions to the office of Assistant United States Attorney MARTHA JOE STROUD and that HELEN LAIDRICH was among such reporters. She said on occasions copies of depositions were known to be in Mr. SANDERS' desk. She said, however, she has no personal recollection of the deposition of JACK L. RUBY or any circumstances surrounding same. She said she has no recollection of seeing the deposition and has no information or knowledge as to how DOROTHY KILGALLEN or any other person may have come into possession of a copy of same.

MARTHA JOE STROUD, Assistant United States Attorney, advised that at about 10:30 or 11:00 a.m., June 12, 1964, HELEN IAIDRICH, court reporter, came to her office and brought a typed transcript of the deposition of JACK L. RUBY to the President's Commission on the Assassination of President KENNEDY. IAIDRICH stated to Miss STROUD she thought perhaps she should hand the document to Mr. H. BAREFOOT SANDERS, the United States Attorney, personally. IAIDRICH delivered the document to Mr. SANDERS.

It is Miss STROUD's understanding the original transcript was mailed to Mr. ARLEN SPECTER of the Commission by Mrs. IVOJEANE ALEXANDER, a secretary in the United States Attorney's Office, without opening the sealed envelope in which it was contained.

Miss STROUD continued, stating that some days later HELEN IAIDRICH returned to the United States Attorney's Office in connection with a query from the Commission as to the proper transcription of a name in the RUBY deposition, whether the name was HARRY CARLSON, as shown, or should be HARRY OLSEN. IAIDRICH requested to see a copy of the transcript which she had left with Mr. SANDERS. The copy, which was being kept in Mr. SANDERS' desk, was obtained by Miss STROUD and his secretary, THELMA ABLES, and was given to IAIDRICH. The latter had her notes with her and took came, with the copy of the transcript, to the office of ODELL OLIVER, court reporter, in the same building, where she remained perhaps fifteen minutes. On her return, IAIDRICH prepared a letter to Mr. J. LEE RANKIN, Counsel to the Commission, advising that upon checking her notes against the transcript, she found the name in question should be HARRY OLSEN. LAIDRICH'S letter was dated June 26, 1964.

Miss STROUD said the copy of the transcript was returned to Mr. SANDERS' desk where it remained for some time thereafter. She said she received a call from Mr. SANDERS recently, at a time when he was out of Dallas. He said he had read in the press of the publication of the transcript of RUBY's deposition under DOROTHY KILGALLEN's name. Mr. SANDERS inquired if she had any information as to the "leak". She replied in the negative. Mr. SANDERS instructed her to obtain the copy from his desk and lock it in her safe, which she did.

Miss STROUD said she has no knowledge as to how DOROTHY KILGALLEN or any other person obtained a copy of the RUBY deposition. She related HELEN IAIDRICH has told her she observed mimeographed copies of the transcript of the RUBY deposition in the offices of the Commission when IAIDRICH was in Washington some weeks ago.

RELEN LAIDRICH, court reporter, residence - 7847 Northaven, advised she was called on Sunday, June 7, 1964, by Mr. SORRELS, United States Secret Service, to the Dallas County Jail to record the interview of JACK L. RUBY by Chief Justice EARL WARREN. She said she understood Miss ODELL OLIVER, court reporter, was to have been used but was not immediately available at the time the interview was to begin. She said she recorded the interview with a stenctype machine. The interview was concluded in mid-afternoon

She stated she had, on returning to her home on the same date, dictated from her stenotype notes to a tape recorder, completing the dictation on the same day, June 7, 1964. She said she had intended transcribing the deposition of RUBY the following day but had to go to Waco, Texas, in connection with a court trial, which demanded her attention until about noon Wednesday, June 10, 1964. She typed the document, consisting of 103 pages, on Wednesday afternoon and Thursday, June 10 and 11, 1964, at her home where she maintains her office. She said she then received permission of United States Attorney H. BAREFOOT SANDERS to have Miss ODELL OLIVER assist her in proofreading the transcript. She took the typed document, original and one copy, along with her notes, to Mies OLIVER's office in the Federal Building, Bryan and Ervay Streets, where Miss OLIVER assisted with the proofreading. She said she felt this procedure desirable as Miss OLIVER was known to be familiar with the spellings of many of the names appearing in the document. She said she, thereafter, on Thursday night and Friday morning, June 11 and 12, 1964, made any necessary corrections. She then erased the tape recording previously made by her from the stenotype notes.

Mrs. LAIDRICH stated that at about 11:00 a.m., Friday, June 12, 1964, she took the original of the deposition, in a sealed envelope, and the copy to Mr. SANDERS, the United States Attorney. She took her notes and carbon paper used in the transcription to Miss OLIVER for her retention.

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She said a letter was subsequently received from J. LEE: RANKIN, Counsel to the President's Commission on the Assassination of President KENNEDY, asking that she determine whether she had erred in typing the name "HARRY CARLSON" " on page 32 on the RUBY deposition, rather than "HARRY OLSEN", " which was believed to be correct. She said she went to Miss OLIVER's office and obtained her notes, and she and Miss OLIVER went to the United States Attorney's office where they checked the notes and copy of the deposition, which was made available to them by Assistant United States Attorney MARTHA JOE STROUD. She said Miss STROUD has advised her that STROUD told FBI Agents, who interviewed STROUD on September 1, 1964, that LAIDRICH had taken the copy of the deposition to Miss OLIVER's office to make the check. She said she reminded Miss STROUD that this was incorrect, that she and Miss OLIVER made the examination in Miss STROUD's office. She said the copy was immediately returned to Miss STROUD, and Miss OLIVER retained the notes. She said it was found she had indeed erred, that the name "HARRY OLSEN" should have appeared on page 32 of the deposition rather than "HARRY CARLEON". She said Mr. RANKIN was informed by letter the same day. She said she did not make the correction on the copy which Mr. SANDERS, the United States Attorney, had retained.

Mrs. LAIDRICH stated she travelled to New York City a few days later and when passing through Washington on June 30, 1964, she stopped by offices of the Commission to pay a courtesy call on personnel she had previously met in Dallas. She said she saw'reproduced copies of the RUBY deposition at the Commission offices. She said she told Mr. BURT GRIFFIN of the Commission staff about the correction which should be made, that is changing the name "HARRY CARLSON" to "HARRY OLSEN". She observed Mr. GRIFFIN make the correction in pencil on a copy of the deposition.
