Er. WAYNE BIRDSELL, Hanager, Ward and Paul, Inc., 917 G Street, E. W., related details as according to his records concerning their handling of transcript of RUEY testimony. BIBLEEL stated this exterial was the 100th such material furnished to Vard and Paul by the Commission for reproduction. According to his receipt, only five copies with the evident of the RULL testimony were delivered to the Cormission at 8:55 p.m. on 6/18/64. This receipt is Ward and Paul Eumber \$350, dated 6/15/64. BIFDSELL states be bas no recollection of this particular document, although it is his boliof the original stemographic transcript was received by his firm on the moraing of June 15, and such a job would have taken approximately three and one-balf to four hours to complete.

Be also states had material boon received on previous day, June 17, it would have been delivered to Cornission early on morning of June 13. DIRECTLA states paper most for reproduction on Zeron machine is pre-stamped "Confidential" with blank paper being run through an old style hand-food Multigraph machine with the word "Confidential" consisting of separate letters blocked in place on the Multigraph cylinder. He produced a roam of such pre-stamped blank paper from which six blank specimen shorts many obtained to be furnished heresith. shoots were obtained to be furnished berevith.

BIRDSELL states his firm has bandled all such testimony and despositions for the Commission and recalls earlier material was all classified "Top Secret"; bowever, by monorandum 6/1/64, from J. LHE RAMELT, Coneral Councel, Vard and Paul were informed that as of that date all despositions and testimonies handled by Ward and Paul would be classified "Confidential". bIFDSELL states Eard and Paul never made extra copies nor retained extra copies of any material relating to Commission business.

BIRDSELL states his firm bandlos classified material including "Secret" and "Top Secret" for such Senate and congressional committees as Armed Services and persons in his firm are "cleared" for such material by Dopartment of Defense.

Instant transcript of RULY bearing was actually run through the Zerox machine by either ROBERT E. HAWLIES or PETE VARE, som of one of the owners. VALU not available for interview, but interview had with ROBERT E. HAVEINS, The has no independent recollection of instant document and transcript; states be has no knowledge of how any leak in could have occurred and personally was not responsible for some. PATE WARD to be interviewed.

Inequiry at the Commission determined three "Confidential" stamps known to have been used during con-duct of Commission inquiry. One such stamp borrowed from Department of Defence and other two starps obtained through requisition from General Services Administration. The stary borrowed from Department of Defence, which is enclosed and marked Kumber One was located in the desk of Mrs. BEVIEWA ART HECKIAN. The second enclosed stamp, which bears Rusber Three, was located in a secretary's dest in a room occupied

by several Commission secretarys. The third stamp was left at Commission effice at request of Mrs. MECKEAN. It is noted this third stamp, which is one of two obtained through General Services Administration, was located in the supply cabinet at the Commission quarters. This stamp has never been used.
