By accident I found a thermofax of my copy of the FBI explaining three shots without Tague. It is CD 298, their illustration of their visuals. I'll add this briefly.

Now I have a clue for looking for a xerox.

This has been a quiet day. Before it got too hot I made a number of trips out and back in the lane, not many at a time but fairly many in number. I think it is good for me but the annoying if minor discomforts continue.

According to our bath scale by switching from wine to whiskey for my selaxant I've knocked some pounds off. I hope the scale is accurate!

I've put a note with the copies and notes raising the question I think we discussed briefly, getting Clapp's records that remain. He has made much ralevant with his affidavit, including in particular the judge's notes he passed around. And did not attach as proof. And I'm sure will not be.

I've been watching the Post's stories on The Case of the Defected Defector with some curiosity, wondering if it is some of the stuff they used in 1448.

It also reminds that the FEI does so operate in intelligence outside the US and then calls it by another name.

The more I think about it the more convinced I become that these 226 affidavits are going to give Pratt a little to think about, including when the appeals judges read them.
