6/24/43, 7 a.m.



There is no news but I have a little while before the first formation so I thought I'd start a letter.

I spoke to Diana last night. She lives about 20 miles from here. She reports Sam was before his O.C.S. class & thinks he made a favorable impression.

And of Joe she says he seems to be happier with his work daily, but he still can't say what he is doing except that it will cost the Japs zero. Sounds like good work.

I got in about 11:15, and just as was falling asleep I got a message she had called me (earlier). Had a little trouble falling asleep again.

I spent the evening in a movie (pretty good) "Hausman Must Die". Then, under the wrong impression about the date, struck a couple of traps into a book to illustrate the end of my 1st 6 months in the army. Then struck down to where
