The John Birch Society says President Kennedy's assassination proves the society was right in its five-year campaign against the "internal menace" of communism.

Mr. Kennedy, the right-wing society says, was killed by a Communist.

The John Birchers took fullpage advertisements in several newspapers over the week end to express that view.

The called for donations from "every red-blooded American" to extend the advertising campaign.

The ad attributed to former Representative Martin Dies, Democrat of Texas, first chairman of the House Un-Ameri-can Acjivities Committee, a statement that the late Lee H. Oswald, the accused assassin, was a Communist.

Oswald had described him-self as a Marxist. The Com-munists have disowned him. The ad said the Communists can be expected "to use the shock, grief and confusion of the American people, resulting from the assassination of our President, as an opportunity for pushing their own plans faster." .
