WORRELL WAS ONE OF FOUR DALLAS COUNTY MEN CALLED TO APPEAR PEFORE THE COMMISSION NEXT TUESDAY. BOB JACKSON OF THE DALLAS TIMES HERALD, A PHOTOGRAPHER IN A PRESS FOCL CAR THAT WAS THE THIRD VEHICLE BEHIND KENNEDY, WAS ONE OF THOSE ASKED TO APPEAR.

ALL FOUR OF THE MEN WERE IN THE VICINITY OF THE ASSASSINATION. ARNOLD LOUIS ROWLAND, 18, DECLINED TO CONFIRM THAT HE WOULD MAKE THE TRIP TO WASHINGTON. TRIP TO WASHINGTON. HE WROTE A STORY AFTER THE ASSASSINATION THAT SAID HE WHIRLED, AND
SAW A RIFLE BARREL IN THE DEPOSITORY WINDOW.
