

## Macabre Tests Used In Warren Investigation

WASHINGTON—The macabre was no hindrance to the Warren Commission in its careful investigation of the Kennedy assassination.

The commission, for example, used Oswald's rifle to fire bullets into "inert skulls" filled with gelatin and covered with animal skin.

Investigators wanted to determine if the damage to the "dummies" approximated the damage to President Kennedy's head as revealed by autopsy. It did.

In addition, the Oswald gun, a 6.5 Mannlicher-Carcano, was used to shoot pieces of animal meat similar in texture and size to Kennedy's neck.

Once again, this grisly testing found that Oswald's gun was the probable murder weapon.

## State Report Due in Week

AUSTIN, Tex. (UPI) — Texas Atty. Gen. Waggoner Carr said today a state report on the assassination of President Kennedy will be ready in a week.

He said it is a "supplementary report" to that of the Warren Commission, which Carr called "very thorough and very complete."

"The objective of the Texas report is to tell the efforts of the Texas officials in the assassination—both in the participation in the (Warren Commission) hearings and in its own investigation of the facts," Carr said.
