She criticized the commission from the Warren report of a detalled account of her son's slaying. The commission said its repart in this area was limited in scope because the Jack Ruby case

still was pending.

Mrs. Oswald charged that the port should not have been ne leased until the Ruby proceedings were completed and hinted that the release date was linked to "political reasons."
"My son was murdered and I

have a right to know the facts,"

she said.

"I can tear this book apart . . it is an insult to the Oswald family and the intelligence of the American people to release this book without a full account of Jack Ruby's murdering my son.

She said a private investigation of her own-waged for 10 months at a cost of more than \$1,000-has produced a number of details that conflict with the findings of the commission.

"I'm not saying that I'm right and they're wrong, but until all the pieces fall into place, I'm going to continue to fight."

She reacted vigorously to what she called a commission inference that "Lee was an assassin because of his environment."

"I am indignant," she said. "None of Lee Harvey Oswald's early history would indicate that he would ever become an assassin, a killer.

"It is ridiculous . . . he was not a thief, a drunkard, a runaround-he had none of these habits. This is the only motive they could find.

"It is a ridiculous accusation.
