For several months the governnent has been attempting to take ermanent custody of the weapons. hey include the 6.5-mm Manlichr-Carcano rifle believed to be the lin custody of the FBI. eapon which killed President ov. John Connally on Nov. 22, **P63.** 

A .38-caliber revolver which lled Officer J. D. Tippit on an ak Cliff street shortly after the sassination also is included in e expected selzure action.

The government's intentions to nfiscate the weapons were conmed by Asst. U.S. Atty. [Tim mmins late Tuesday in a stateent authorized by the Departnt of Justice.

The guns, which have been in lenndy and severely wounded the custody of the Department of Justice or the Warren Commission since shortly after the assassination and the killing of Oswald, have been the subject of controversy.

A special congressional bill

which would permit the government to permanently seize the weapons is also pending and a sederal civil suit is now on file in Denver.

In that suit, a Colorado oilman filed for possession of the weapons, which he claimed were sold to him by the widow of the assassin for \$10,000.

John J. King of Inglewood, Colo., filed the suit against the Justice Department, but Mrs. Marina Oswald did not join in the action.

In addition to the reported sale price, another payment was to be made if the guns were recovered from the government.

The suit claimed the Justine Department has been using the euphemism that "the matter is under study" in declining to give him the weapons.
