NEW YORK--NEGOTIATIONS FOR AN OUT OF COURT SETTLEMENT CONTINUED TODAY IN THE PROTRACTED BATTLE OVER THE PUBLICATION OF WILLIAM MANCHESTER'S BOOK "THE DEATH OF A PRESIDENT."

ATTORNEYS FOR MRS. JOHN F. KENNEDY, MANCHESTER AND THE PUBLISHING HOUSE OF HARPER & ROW MET FOR 40 MINUTES WITH JUSTICE SAUL S. STREIT TO DISCUSS "PROCEDURES," ACCORDING TO STREIT. HE SAID IN EVENT A COMPROMISE COULD NOT BE REACHED, "CERTAIN TECHNICAL PROCEDURES MUST BE WORKED OUT BEFORE GOING TO TRIAL."

"BUT THE PARTIES ARE SANGUINE ABOUT THE OUTCOME," HE SAID.

A HEARING ON MRS. KENNEDY'S MOTION TO BAR PUBLICATION OF THE BOOK AND TO FORCE MANCHESTER TO RETURN TAPED INTERVIEWS WITH HER AND COPIES OF LETTERS IS SCHEDULED FOR TOMORROW BEFORE STREIT. KNOWLEDGE-ABLE COURT SOURCES SAID THE MOTION PROBABLY WILL AGAIN BE POSTPONED.

"AS FAR AS I KNOW, EVERYBODY IS HAPPY," SAID FORMER FEDERAL JUDGE SIMON F. RIFKIND, MRS. KENNEDY'S ATTORNEY. "AT LEAST WE'RE STILL TALKING."
